SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

The City Attorney's Office is requesting a resolution for the City Council to approve appointments to the "For" and "Against" Committees for Proposition No. 1, which will be submitted to the voters at the November 5, 2024, General Election. The proposition requests voters to approve or reject a levy lid lift for regular property taxes that would help fund the Tacoma Fire Department, and would provide for enhanced facilities, equipment and staffing.

BACKGROUND:

On June 18, 2024, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 41454, transmitting a ballot measure concerning the Tacoma Fire Department property tax levy, to the Pierce County Auditor to be placed on the ballot for the General Election on Tuesday, November 5, 2024. Per the Revised Code of Washington 29A.32.280, for each measure from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters' pamphlet, the legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voters' approval of the measure, and shall formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voters' rejection of the measure. The City reached out to the community to look for those interested in serving on the committees by notifying those on the mailing lists from the Tacoma Fire Department, those on the agenda notification lists, Neighborhood Council contacts, as well as anyone else who expressed interest in the past about the topic, and posted the request on the City's notices page. The Government Performance and Finance Committee reviewed letters of interest at their regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, July 16, 2024, and provided recommendations for the appointment of individuals for the "For" and "Against" Committees for Proposition No. 1.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:

The City requested members of the public to volunteer for the "For" and "Against" committees.
