# **ITEMS OF INTEREST**

- 1. Community and Economic Development Director Ricardo Noguera provides the attached memorandum regarding the 2015 official population estimate for the City of Tacoma. The 202,300 figure represents an increase of 3,903 persons, or a 2% increase, from the 2010 Federal Census count. # STUDY SESSION/WORK SESSION

3. The City Council Study Session of Tuesday, July 14, 2015, will be held in Room 16 of the Tacoma Municipal Building North, at Noon. Discussion items will be: (1) Draft Transportation Master Plan; (2) Tacoma Link Expansion Environmental Review and Comments; (3) Other Items of Interest; (4) Committee Reports; and (5) Agenda Review and City Manager's Weekly Report.

At Tuesday's Study Session, Public Works staff will present the Transportation Commission approved Draft Transportation Master Plan. The presentation will include an overview of the development of the Draft Transportation Master Plan, public outreach and summary of comments, highlights of the Draft Transportation Master Plan, and an outline of the Commission's work plan to further develop the Plan. The Draft Final Transportation Master Plan approved by the Transportation Commission in June, is available for review at <a href="https://www.cityoftacoma.org/tmp">www.cityoftacoma.org/tmp</a>. Public Works Director Kurtis Kingsolver provides the attached memorandum with additional background information.

As a second item on Tuesday's Study Session, Sue Comis, Sound Transit Project Manager for the Tacoma Link Expansion Project, will present the findings of the environmental review phase of the project. She will also outline the process and events for public comment on the project in light of the findings and next steps for advancing the project.

# **GRANT APPLICATIONS**

- 5. The City has applied for the following grants:
  - COPS Community Policing Development (Micro Grant) Funding to offer educational workshops with consistent monthly check-in meetings for youth and parallel parent/guardian workshops related to individual choices and consequences. The goal is to support positive change in the youth's current path and connect them with identified community resources and a mentor to guide/support them as needed as they make the positive choices and changes necessary to separate themselves from the pathway into the juvenile justice system. Tacoma Police Department Juvenile Detectives will take on the role of a mentor by making referrals to services, follow-up meetings, phone calls, and providing additional events to keep the juveniles engaged in the program. The City is requesting \$70,000 with no match required.
  - COPS Community Policing Development (Emerging Issues Forums)


     Funding to partner with the Government for Racial Equity and Center for Social Inclusion. Tacoma Police will work to host and participate in national conversations about race and community trust. The culmination will be training curriculum to be used nationally. The City is requesting \$500,000 with no City match required.
  - COPS Community Policing Development (21st Century Policing) Tacoma Police is applying for funding to start convening a series of "Community Room Conversations" between law enforcement and the community. The goal of these dialogues is to: 1) understand historical impacts and structural inequalities; 2) acknowledge past and present injustices; 3) promote racial reconciliation and community healing across all demographics; 4) collect qualitative data; and, 5) make policies available for public review, comment and development.

The Washington State Office of Financial Management (OFM) has released the April 1, 2015 population estimates for cities, towns and counties in Washington State. The official 2015 population estimate for the City of Tacoma is 202,300. This figure represents an increase of 3,903 persons or ~2.0% increase from the 2010 Federal Census count. #### **SUMMARY:**

Public Works staff will present the Transportation Commission approved Draft Transportation Master Plan at the July 14, 2015, City Council Study Session meeting. The presentation will include an overview of the development of the Draft Transportation Master Plan, public outreach and summary of comments, highlights of the Draft Transportation Master Plan, and an outline of the Commission's work plan to further develop the Draft Transportation Master Plan. The Draft Final Transportation Master Plan approved by the Transportation Commission June 2015, is available for review www.cityoftacoma.org/tmp. The presentation is for informational purposes and no City Council action is being requested at this time.

#### BACKGROUND:

The Transportation Commission began this effort in fall 2013. The Draft Transportation Master Plan provides a long-term vision for transportation infrastructure in the City of Tacoma. It is a primary tool for forecasting transportation demand and identifying services and improvements needed to achieve those goals and accommodate future demands.

The information developed in this document will also be used to update the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan. The document represents a significant update to previous Transportation Elements, and builds on the advances of the Mobility Master Plan. The new document focuses on an integrated multimodal approach to transportation. Principal routes are identified for each mode, including transit and streetcar priority corridors. The Draft Transportation Master Plan also prescribes performance measures for tracking the implementation of the vision in the TMP.

#### **ISSUE:**

The City is required to update the Comprehensive Plan periodically in accordance with RCW 36.70A.130. Significant updates are proposed to the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan; this work was conducted as part of the Transportation Master Plan development. The City's Transportation Commission has approved a version of this document, which the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee has forwarded to the Planning Commission for consideration as part of the Comprehensive Plan update process.
