

RESOLUTION NO. 41658

A RESOLUTION relating to homelessness; authorizing the execution of an agreement with The Rescue Mission, in the amount of \$3,500,000, budgeted from the General Fund, for the purpose of supporting The Rescue Mission's men's shelter expansion of 100 beds, to reduce the number of individuals residing in unauthorized encampments and areas unfit for human habitation.

WHEREAS the City Council has identified homelessness and housing stability as a top priority, emphasizing the need to create sustainable solutions to address unsheltered homelessness, expand affordable housing opportunities, and ensure equitable access to essential services, and

WHEREAS The Rescue Mission ("TRM") was established in 1912, and offers meals, shelter, recovery, and faith formation to people experiencing homelessness, and TRM's Shelter Expansion Project ("Project") is a critical initiative developed to address the increased demand for emergency shelter in the City, and

WHEREAS the City is facing a critical shortage of shelter capacity resulting in growing encampments and an increased burden on existing resources and emergency response services, and this shortage negatively impacts public health, safety, stability, and wellbeing, and exacerbates issues related to unsheltered homelessness including poor health outcomes, higher rates of mental illness and substance abuse, and an increased need for support from law enforcement, emergency response, and medical services, and

WHEREAS there are currently 1,099 shelter beds available in the City for single adults, families, youth, young adults, and survivors of domestic violence



experiencing homelessness, and

WHEREAS the Pierce County comprehensive plan to end homelessness has projected a need for an additional 200 shelter beds in the City of Tacoma, and

WHEREAS, through this Project, TRM will increase its capacity by 100 permanent shelter beds to provide basic emergency shelter and services for additional persons experiencing homelessness in the City of Tacoma by expanding capacity in the men's wing congregate shelter space on TRM's downtown campus, which will help to address this urgent need for year-round availability and access to supportive services to help individuals transition to stable housing with a commitment to continue doing so for at least five years after completion, and

WHEREAS the City has been operating under a state of emergency in response to the rising number of people experiencing homelessness since May 2017, and

WHEREAS given the growing urgency to expand emergency shelter capacity, the City is committed to providing \$3,500,000 to increase shelter capacity and supportive services for people experiencing homelessness, and

WHEREAS this Project is in partnership with Pierce County and in alignment with the Comprehensive Plan to End Homelessness shelter plan, and the \$3,500,000 budgeted from the General Fund will become available to TRM after the City has finalized its contract with the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development to deposit \$4,000,000 into the Federal Housing



and Urban Development Fund and pass thru those funds to TRM thru the execution of a separate contract as an additional contribution to the Project, and

WHEREAS the total cost for the Project is \$19,101,267, to be funded as follows: (1) City of Tacoma, in the amount of \$3,500,000; (2) United States

Department of Housing and Urban Development, in the amount of \$4,000,000 passed thru the City of Tacoma to TRM thru the execution of a separate contract; (3) Pierce County, in the amount of \$5,500,000; (4) Washington State Commerce, in the amount of \$5,000,000, and (5) The Rescue Mission, in the amount of \$1,101,267; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the foregoing Recitals are incorporated herein as the City Council's legislative findings.

Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to enter into a Funding and Operations Agreement with The Rescue Mission, in the amount of \$3,500,000, budgeted from the General Fund for the purpose of supporting The Rescue Mission's Men's Shelter expansion of 100 beds, to reduce the number of individuals residing in unauthorized encampments and areas unfit for human habitation, said document to be substantially in the form of the agreement on file in the office of the City Clerk.

Section 3. That the City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to take and execute any additional measures or documents that may be necessary



	to complete this transaction, which are consistent with the approved form of
