This letter is in written response to your amendment request regarding a cost change within your grant. The approved increase for the third year is \$575,380 (salary -\$78,211; benefits \$36,865), for funding five positions under the FY2013 SAFER Veteran Hiring Program. The total revised grant amount as a result of this amendment is \$4,021,560.

Additional Requirements:

The recipient agrees that all allocations and use of funds under this grant will be in accordance with the FY 2013 Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response Program Guidance. Specific requirements for the FY 2013 SAFER Veterans Hiring Program are as follows:

This is a two-year period of performance with an additional third year for the FY 2013 SAFER Veterans Hiring Program for grants awarded under the Hiring of Firefighters Category. Recipient agrees not to exceed the annual budget awarded per firefighter (salary and benefits). Should the actual salary and benefits costs requested for reimbursement exceed awarded Federal funds, the grantee would be obligated to pay 100 percent of those costs. Therefore, please be sure you have provided accurate salary and benefit information and have confirmed this information with your Human Resources and/or Financial Office. All other terms and conditions of the grant remain unchanged.

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Article I - Project Description

The purpose of the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response program is to provide funding directly to fire departments and volunteer firefighter interest organizations in order to help them increase or maintain the number of trained, "front line" firefighters available in their communities.
