1. <u>24-0106</u>	Home in Tacoma Project - Phase 2 Update [Brian Boudet, Planning Manager; Elliott Barnett, Senior Planner; Alyssa Torrez, Senior Planner, Planning and Development Services]
	At approximately 12:00 p.m., Brian Boudet, Planning Division Manager, Planning and Development Services (PDS), introduced Corey Newton, Site and Building Division Manager, and Elliott Barnett and Alyssa Torrez, Senior Planners, PDS; and provided a brief background on Home in Tacoma Phase 2, including an agenda, revised project schedule, and overview.
	Council Member Rumbaugh arrived here, at 12:05 p.m.
	Boudet continued with what areas are included in Home in Tacoma (HIT). Barnett presented the public review package; summaries; factors that affected the proposed zoning framework; housing types, noting houseplex, rowhouse, and multiplex; Urban Residential (UR) zoning map; how proposed UR zones work; parking requirements; tree requirements; residential target areas; and guide to the Tacoma Municipal Code changes. Newton continued with a site planning exercise, noting example scenarios tested; site planning outcomes; and Draft Environmental Impact Statement, noting purpose, methodology, community ask, and conclusions. Torrez concluded with how the City is informing the community, noting Environmental Impact Statement, and interactive map; how to get involved with in-person events; and how to leave

comments.

Discussion ensued regarding the site planning exercise, noting potential collaboration with developers, builders, architects, and zoning; appreciation for the updates; interactive map; expansion of the Multi-Family Tax Exemption; multi-lingual access; tree canopy, noting tree management in City right-of-way, tiny forests, and tracking tree bonuses; zoning code variances; engagement with youth; homeownership and condo liability; reduced parking requirements, including major transit stops; critical area development; Manitou annexation zoning; conversations with Pierce County regarding zoning; residential target areas; and tree protection.
