






## I-5 CROSSING STUDY \*\*\* ASSESSMENT










Project Detail: This planning study will assess 14 existing I-5 bridges/undercrossings in support of federal "Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program". This project supports WSDOT's I-5 Systems Partnership to reduce barriers that I-5 creates in the community.

Funding: \$350,000 Real Estate Excise Tax

# MANITOU ELEMENTARY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS





Project Detail: Construct crosswalk improvements, standard/buffered/protected bike lanes, transit islands, illumination, bike storage, wayfinding, and providing education/encouragement

Funding: WSDOT Safe Routes to School Grant \$543,091; Streets Initiative Match \$55,000

# E 64<sup>TH</sup> STREET: MCKINLEY TO PORTLAND AVE (PHASE II)





Scope: Roadway rehabilitation, cycle track, sidewalks, curb ramps, stormwater and system upgrades, streetlight and signal upgrades.

Funding: Transportation Improvement Board \$4,000,000; Complete Streets Grant \$450,000; Streets Initiative \$4,500,000

## PRAIRIE LINE TRAIL PHASE 2 & WATER FLUME LINE TRAIL PHASE 3







Scope: Construct shared use path, signal upgrades, curb ramps, wayfinding, landscaping, art, and stormwater.

Funding: PSRC Countywide \$5,590,491; PSRC Federal Highway Administration \$4,400,000; Other City Funds \$6,067,669

### PUYALLUP AVENUE CORRIDOR






Project Detail: Designs and constructs streetscape improvements, upgrades utilities, improves ADA access, reduces pavement width, and adds an HOV/Transit lane and bicycle facilities

Funding: Federal Grant \$2,162,500; Streets Initiative \$592,500; Unidentified City \$3,260,705; Unidentified Grant \$19,072,895
