Tacoma: Improving Bike & Pedestrian Safety Around Schools	Washington Traffic Safety Commission \$60,000	This grant provides funding for additional enforcement before & after school, school-based programs to encourage walking and bicycling, a walking audit to identify barriers for safe access, and the development of curriculum to promote safe walking and bicycling. Portland Avenue Freight and Access Improvements	PSRC Countywide Program \$370,430	This grant provides design funding for replacement of asphalt with concrete from Lincoln Ave. to E. 25 th Street, roadway re-channelization from E. 25 th to E. 27 th Street to tie-in to the Portland Avenue interchange portion of WSDOT's I-5 HOV project, addition of a new traffic signal at the SR-509 off ramp and upgrades to three existing signals to interconnect all four traffic signals. The project will also add missing link sidewalk, ADA curb ramps and a mid-block crossing. A City match of \$65,370 is required and funded via the Streets Initiative Fund. Puyallup Ave. Transit/Complete Street Improvements	PSRC Countywide Program \$2,100,000	This grant provides design funding for Puyallup Avenue from Portland Avenue to S. C Street. The project scope includes a complete reconstruction of the roadway with concrete pavement, complete street elements including bike lanes, sidewalks/curb ramps, bulbouts, crosswalks, signals/APS and other ITS elements, lighting, landscaping, bus stops, parking and upgraded utilities. 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South I Street Overlay	PSRC Countywide Program \$750,000	This grant provides funding for an asphalt overlay on South I Street at the intersection of 6 th Avenue. The overlay will extend in each of the 4 directions of the intersection for about one block. The project will also include ADA ramp upgrades as needed and bike lanes on the 6 th Avenue leg. The project will also install APS, ADA crossing improvements, median island and pedestrian actuated rectangular rapid flashing beacons.
