Utilities - Tacoma Rail, for North Lead Rail Project contribution - February 23, 2016.

SUMMARY:

As required by RCW 39.34.030, Tacoma Rail requests City Council's approval to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with the Port of Tacoma, which includes a provision for Tacoma Rail to make a \$2,000,000 contribution toward completion of a mutually beneficial track reconfiguration and improvement project.

The project, commonly referred to as the Port of Tacoma North Lead Rail Improvements Project, proposes to reconfigure the existing access points to the Tacoma Rail classification yard, and construct two (2) additional long intermodal tracks, in addition to other project related activities.

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

BACKGROUND:

Tacoma Rail in partnership with the Port of Tacoma recognizes that the assurance of continuing freight movement throughout Puget Sound is an issue of critical strategic importance to the City/Tacoma Rail and the Port of Tacoma, and the parties have concluded that the proposed project is necessary to increase the capacity and efficiency of the local freight rail system to support anticipated future growth.

Assuming Tacoma Public Utility Board approval on February 10, 2016, and City Council approval on February 23, 2016, this Interlocal Agreement will be before the Port of Tacoma Commission for approval during their meeting on March 17, 2016.

Following approval of the Interlocal Agreement by the required governing bodies, Port staff will seek authorization from the Port Commission to proceed with advertisement of the project bid specification.

ISSUE:

Each party owns land, railroad track, and supporting facilities which function as a port and freight rail system within the general area frequently referred to as the Tacoma Tide flats.

ALTERNATIVES:

One alternative is to take no action. However, that approach is not considered to be prudent by either party, and would likely be detrimental to our ongoing efforts to maintain and enhance our regional competitiveness.



RECOMMENDATION:

Tacoma Rail recommends that City Council authorize participation in the Interlocal Agreement with the Port of Tacoma for this railroad track reconfiguration and improvement project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This expenditure is within the current authorized Capital Outlay budget parameters for Tacoma Rail.
