2015-2019 Human Services Strategic Plan

- Identifies the City of Tacoma's most pressing human services issues Articulates community stakeholders' expectations of the Human Services Division
- Sets Investment Priorities, Goals, and Funding Policies
- Identifies the role of the Human Services Division in the broader context of social services investing.

Recommendations resulting from Community Scan

- Stay focused on the strategic priorities in the current plan
- Inject equity in the human services funding application process and in decisions about distribution of resources
- Develop an incremental and integrated approach to systems impact
- Ensure the City's human services investments are serving the entire community, not just people who know how to navigate the human services system.

Recommended Changes to Funding Priorities and Policy

- Make slight changes to two funding priorities:
 - Increase Employability, and Self- sufficiency determination, and Empowerment for Adults
 - Enhance Mental Health and Chemical Dependency Substance Use Disorder Services
- Adds non-competitive (Direct) Funding Policy
- Includes language directing special Funding:
 - Continue Stabilization Funds
 - Create an Innovation and Capacity Building Fund
 - Create an MHSUD Capacity Building Fund
- Adds two criteria for funding
 - Participate in local/regional systems work.
 - Value and incorporate equity and empowerment.
