### **ITEMS OF INTEREST**

2. Mayor Woodards provides the attached **Council Action Memorandum**, a Resolution for a **Council contingency fund expenditure of \$10,000 to sponsor the Together We End Gun Violence Conference**.
3. Office of Arts & Cultural Vitality 2022 Annual Overview of Impact Update: 2022 was a year of reimagining, rebuilding, and reconnecting as our community adapted to the new norms and evolving community needs that have been revealed over the past few years.

The Office of Arts & Cultural Vitality, in partnership with the Tacoma Arts Commission and the Tacoma Creates Advisory Board, is proud to support Tacoma's creative ecosystem in this challenging work, providing support to creatives and organizations as well as enhanced opportunities for our community to access and participate in the cultural community in a variety of ways across all neighborhoods. **The [2022 Annual Report](#) illustrates the far-reaching impacts the City's investments in the cultural sector have on our community, the full 2022 Annual Report is available [here](#).**

City-funded Temporary and Emergency Shelter Performance: The City posts weekly information about its Temporary and Emergency Shelter locations including current census, number of available beds and exits to housing. 7. **Encampment Outreach:** The City's Homeless Engagement and Alternatives Liaison (HEAL) Team (formerly the Homeless Outreach Team) performs encampment outreach throughout the week to provide individuals opportunities to connect to shelter, behavioral health, substance use and employment services. **For the week of April 3 - 7, 2023, staff visited seven locations. This resulted in thirty - five individuals being contacted and referred to community services and one individual accepting shelter.**
8. **Holy Rosary Safe Parking Site:** **The Safe Parking Site at Holy Rosary is expected to open on Monday, April 17, 2023. Catholic Community Services is currently coordinating with the Homeless Engagement Alternative Liaison (HEAL) Team and contracted outreach providers to develop a list of families and singles who are using their vehicles as sheltering and have been screened for intake so they can access this site.** As a reminder, the site is expected to serve up to 40 individuals and/or up to 20 vehicles and will provide access to hygiene services such as bathroom, showers, and laundry for residents who are staying on site. The residents will also have access to Case Management to assist with permanent housing solutions. **For donations, please reach out to Megan at [meganed@ccsw.org](mailto:meganed@ccsw.org) or 253-365-4111 for an approved list of items needed for the site.**
9. **Emergency Rental Assistance:** The Pierce County Rental Assistance program stopped on August 1, 2022; however, applications will be processed normally until all funds have been distributed, this includes both Pierce County and City of Tacoma funds. This closure will not affect applications already in process. Since 2021, the City has provided 1,168 households with \$8,661,498 in rental assistance **(this is an increase of 4 household and \$31,237, in assistance over last report)**. The City has now fully expended its ERA 1 award and its set aside for utility assistance from ERA 2 funds. When we launched this program in 2020, we set a goal of having at least 45% of the households served headed by a person of color, to date, 65% of the households served are headed by a person of color. The City's Rental Assistance Fund at the Greater Tacoma Community Foundation has received 32 gifts totaling \$33,380.

On our first agenda item, the Office of Environmental Policy and Sustainability will present the **2022 progress update on the City's Climate Action Plan**. The update will report on the citywide efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and build greater resilience in the face of Climate Change.

On our second agenda item, **staff will provide an update that will confirm ballot language to be adopted during April 18, 2023**, Council meeting and for the August 8, 2023, Primary Election, and brief Council on the next steps for the election, including appointments for the For & Against Committees.



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**SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:**

A resolution authorizing a Council Contingency Fund expenditure of \$10,000 to sponsor the Together We End Gun Violence Conference.

**COUNCIL SPONSORS:**

Mayor Victoria Woodards, Deputy Mayor Kristina Walker, and Council Member Kiara Daniels

**BACKGROUND:**

Gun violence is a fatal epidemic continuing to plague cities across the U.S. Our region has experienced an alarming increase in violence over the last four years, impacting our beloved communities every day, and leaving many residents eager to address the issue. Recognizing the need for a comprehensive and collaborative regional and state-wide approach to addressing gun violence through a public health lens, this conference brings together leaders who believe that by working together, from the grassroots to the grass tops we can identify and implement lasting solutions.

Thursday, May 25 & Friday, May 26, community members, community-based organizations, cross-systems partners, health professionals, educators, youth changemakers, advocates, lawmakers, and technical leaders will convene for a two-day conference to deepen understanding, practice, and collaboration in Community Violence Intervention (CVI) ecosystems.

This two-day conference will highlight survivors, thought-leaders, community leaders, health professionals, local officials, and national experts leading the way in ending the gun violence epidemic.

The conference aims to raise Awareness of Gun Violence as a Public Health Issue, deepen Understanding of CVI Best-Practices, spark Connections and Collaboration, learn from Survivors taking action, and identify Sustainable Responses and Elevate Community-led Solutions to Gun Violence.

The Mayor’s Office has been a regular partner and has worked with conference organizers to provide comments and suggestions to inform conference activities, invited partners, post-conference events that may create regional alignment and more. This funding would support the overall conference and highlight Tacoma’s sponsorship as the hosting City of this conference that will become an annual event, hosted in different cities each year.

**COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:**



Gun violence continues to be top of mind for Tacoma residents. From public comments, social media posts, and regular resident emails to the City we are hearing from the community that safety and gun violence are priorities that the city must address.

**2025 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:**

**Equity and Accessibility:**

This conference focuses on grassroots leaders who are on the front lines addressing gun violence in their communities. The learning and discussions focus on lived experience of those in communities impacted by gun violence and working in that space every day. By centering local leaders and lived experience we are creating strong outcomes and more equitable and sustainable policies.

**Civic Engagement:** *Equity Index Score: Moderate Opportunity*

Increase the percentage of residents who believe they are able to have a positive impact on the community and express trust in the public institutions in Tacoma.

**Livability:** *Equity Index Score: Moderate Opportunity*

Increase positive public perception of safety and overall quality of life. Improve health outcomes and reduce disparities, in alignment with the community health needs assessment and CHIP, for all Tacoma residents

The Conference will connect local residents and organizations with elected leadership and experts to create a shared learning space that aims to build trust together. These shared learning spaces will bring new resources, ideas, and alignment that strives to improve community safety and improve health outcomes across Tacoma.
