- 6-Year Planning Document for Transportation Projects
- Updated Annually
- Reviewed by Transportation Commission
- Approved by City Council

Capital Facilities Plan


- Required by WA State Growth Management Act and TMC
- 6-Year Planning Document for All Projects
- Reviewed for alignment with Comprehensive Plan by Planning Commission
- Adopted Along with the City's Biennial Budget

How does a project get into the CFP?

- Projects should flow from other plans
 - Vision 2050
 - Tacoma 2025
 - Comprehensive Plan
- CFP should be the narrowest plan
 - Represents "achievable" projects over the 6-year period
 - Make projects eligible for different funding sources

- Develops project proposals
- Planning Commission (CFP) and Transportation Commission (TIP)
 - Ensures alignment with Comprehensive Plan
 - Guides project prioritization
- City Manager
 - Proposes allocation of available funding, balancing a variety of input sources
- City Council
 - Approves TIP, CFP documents
 - · Approves project funding through the Capital Budget Ordinance

- Taking care of what we have
 - Life Cycle City Resolution (RES-38188, 2011)
 - Green Building Policy (RES-38249, 2011)
 - Decarbonization (RES-40776, 2021)
- Facilities Needs
 - Approx. \$15M-\$17M in predicted ongoing renewals (biennial)
 - Additional One-Time New, Renovation, Level of Service Upgrades Needed
- Repair & Replacement
 - · Added to the baseline as spilt between REET and General Fund
 - \$6.8M in Proposed 23-24 Budget





- Council Prerogative
- Funds in Ordinance:
 - 1060 Transportation
 - 1140 Paths and Trails
 - 3211 Capital Projects
- Multi-Year Appropriation (6year authorization)
- Funding Sources: Real Estate Excise Tax (REET) and General Fund
- · Utilities are different

Capital Budget Highlights

- 26 Projects
 - 20 Transportation
 - Unfit/Unsafe Sidewalk Program (\$2.9M)
 - Portland Avenue Safety and Active Transportation (\$1.9M)
 - Safe Routes to Schools Infrastructure (\$1.1M)
 - 3 Paths and Trails
 - Scott Pierson Trail (\$250k)
 - Historic Water Ditch Trail (\$4.1M)
 - Prairie Line Trail (\$200k)
 - 3 Capital Projects
 - Fire Station Security Improvements (\$750k)
 - New Maintenance Facility Design (\$200k)
 - Main Library Remodel (\$2M)

Capital Budget Challenges

- Escalation Funding
 - Brewery District Revitalization (\$320k)
 - Railroad Crossing (\$500k)
 - East 64th Phase II (\$3.4M)
 - Safe Routes to School (\$100k)
- Grant Match
- Need for Capital dollars outpaces revenues
 - Repair and Replacement
 - Level of Service Considerations
 - General Government Facilities
