Pam Duncan introduces AI Ratcliffe to the commission to begin the discussion regarding the Tacoma Mental Health Chemical Dependency (TMHCD) sales tax and Mental Health Substance Use Disorder (MHSUD) services in the community. The ordinance that established the sales tax is introduced to the group. AI Ratcliffe begins by detailing the history of government funding of MHSUD services and Pierce County's efforts to pass the sales tax. The City of Tacoma passed the one tenth of one percent sales tax in 2012. Kim Dodds developed and implemented the MHSUD system in Tacoma. The MHSUD collaboration meetings are
