

## **RESOLUTION NO. 41677**

A RESOLUTION relating to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the Professional and Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC 17), Tacoma Police Department Non-Commissioned Management Unit, regarding a new classification entitled Crime Analyst Manager.

WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and the administration, and

WHEREAS Resolution No. 41250, adopted July 25, 2023, authorized the execution of the four-year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the City of Tacoma and the Professional and Technical Employees, Local 17 ("PROTEC 17"), Tacoma Police Department Non-Commissioned Management Unit, ("Union"), on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and

WHEREAS the City and the Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement ("LOA") to the CBA regarding a new classification to be titled Crime Analyst Manager, to be created and represented by the Professional and Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC 17), Tacoma Police Department Non-commissioned Management Unit, and

WHEREAS the Crime Analyst Manager classification will be unclassified, appointive, consistent with other titles in Section 2.1 of the Parties' CBA, and will be designated as overtime category "D", Fair Labor Standards Act exempt, and not eligible for overtime or compensatory time off, and

WHEREAS the LOA provides for the 2025 rates of pay, and a general wage increase of 3.0 percent to be applied effective January 1, 2026, and



WHEREAS the Tacoma Police Department management have identified Jacqueline Shelton to be appointed to the Crime Analyst Manager classification following City Council approval of the LOA, and

WHEREAS the LOA also provides that Ms. Shelton will receive a one-time, lump sum payment of \$5,200 in the first full pay period after her appointment to the Crime Analyst Manager classification, and

WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the Professional and Technical Employees, Local 17 (PROTEC 17), Tacoma Police Department Non-Commissioned Management Unit, said document to be substantially in the form of the document on file in the office of the City Clerk.
