The expiration date of the federal grant funding used by the Port to fund this agreement requires the City to expedite the completion of this agreement and its related project.

Authorizing an interlocal agreement with the Port of Tacoma and receiving \$210,000 for the Fire Department's coordination and management of the implementation of the Port of Tacoma Emergency Warning System.

7. BACKGROUND INFORMATION/GENERAL DISCUSSION: (Why is this request necessary? Are there legal requirements? What are the viable alternatives? Who has been involved in the process?)

As part of their continuing emergency management planning, the Port and the City both desire to enhance the ability to warn citizens of certain potential Port area emergency events through the installation and support of a Port of Tacoma Emergency Warning System (PEWS). The agreement establishes the Fire Department as the project manager for the Port for the project. The proposed interlocal agreement assigns tasks and establishes project milestones for the Fire Department to coordinate the accomplishment of the work. As part of the agreement, the Port will pay to the City \$210,000 of federal Port Security grant funding to compensate the City for the work performed by the Fire Department over a five-month period. All project work tasks are required to be completed no later than January 31, 2014.
