SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

The purpose of this item is to Request an Ordinance for a 10 year Telecommunications Franchise Agreement between the City of Tacoma and Ziply Fiber Pacific, LLC. This is the first such ordinance for Ziply Fiber. We have reviewed their request, negotiated terms, and reached a tentative agreement pending City Council consideration and approval. Based on Ziply Fiber's Financial and Technical abilities, and History as a provider and vendor, we are recommending passage of this Request for Ordinance.

BACKGROUND:

This Department's Recommendation is Based On State and Local Law which requires a Telecommunications Provider to have a Franchise Agreement to operate in the City of Tacoma Public Right of Way.
