Subject: Fiscal Impact for Non- Represented Employees, and Tacoma Fire Fighters, Local 31

Overview

The following provides a fiscal impact for an ordinance amending The Tacoma Municipal Code (TMC) Compensation Plan, Chapter 1.12, to implement rates of pay and compensation for certain represented and non-represented employees.

Financial Impact

Effective January 1, 2024, non-represented employees shall receive a two and three-quarters percent (2.75%) increase to their general wage.

Standby Pay

Increase non-represented employees' standby rate from \$3.00/hour to \$3.75/hour.

City of Tacoma Memorandum

Local 31

In the 2023-2025 Collective Bargaining Agreement, Local 31 and City of Tacoma agreed all classifications shall increase by an amount equal to one hundred percent (100%) of CPI-W with a minimum increase of one percent (1%) and a maximum increase of five percent (5%). Effective January 1, 2024, Tacoma Fire Fighters Union, Local 31 shall receive a four and a half percent (4.5%) general wage adjustment based on CPI-W.
