# Interim City Manager Expectations | Workplan

# 1. Assisting Council with Policy Making Role

- Vision 2035 | Q4 2025 → Future-focused, strategic planning lens for Council that aligns existing plans, including a process to adapt ongoing planning efforts annually.
  - Expected deliverable: Presentation Q4 2025 with corresponding ownership by Council in 2026.
- Council Onboarding | Q4 2025 → Updated processes, structures and materials to provide new City Council Members the information and resources they need to govern effectively.
  - Expected outcome: Council onboarding materials available end of year, along with budget and departmental overviews in Q1 2026.

## 2. Organizational Performance and Internal Administration

- Balanced Budget Execution Mid-Mod | October 2025 → Propose options to close structural gaps through service level planning based on transparent, data-informed analysis of tradeoffs.
  - Expected deliverable: Mid-mod presentation in October. Start recovery planning efforts for 2027-2028 biennial budget in Q1-Q3 2026.
- Concurrent Pilot Program (Housing & Franchises) | Q1 2026-Q4 2026 → Innovation in internal systems to improve efficiency and reduce friction in service delivery.
  - Expected deliverable: Presentation to City Council Q4 2025 with pilot launch at the start of 2026.
- Council Strategy (Retreat) 2026 | Q4 2025 Q1 2026 → Reinforce prioritized initiatives with structured dialogue and strategy-setting at department level in preparation for Council strategy session.
  - Expected deliverable: Director's Retreat on organizational assessment in preparation for confirmation or new Council direction in 2026.
- Transition Planning | Q4 2025 Q1 2026 → Ensure Council is supported with executive recruitments, onboarding, and communication of leadership transitions.

**Expected deliverable:** Recruitment and Council confirmation of HR Director (Q4 2025) and NCS Director (Q1 2026).

### 3. Communication

- Revenue Strategy Roadmap | Q4 2025 → Develop a clear, sequenced set of revenue options aligned with fiscal needs and community expectations
  - (Public Safety Sales Tax, SDA/Impact Fees, SI2, Library, Dome PDA, RFA/Fire Levy).
  - Expected deliverable: Draft sequence of revenue options for Council consideration to begin in Q4 2025.

#### 4. Council Initiatives

- Tacoma Rescue Mission (TRM) Shelter Expansion | Q3 2025 Q4 2026 → Support our TRM partner to bring project online by leveraging federal pass-through funding to deliver expanded bed capacity by Q4 2026 in alignment with Council's priority initiative on homelessness.
  - Expected deliverable: Timely communication to City Council and TRM on dynamic changes to federal funding.
- Tacoma Urban Canopy Project | Q4 2025 and beyond → Partner with Department of Ecology (DOE) on demonstration project ahead of Interlocal Agreement (ILA) to deploy new trees and de-paving programs in Tacoma.
  - Expected deliverable: Established ILA with DOE and to be determined number of new trees planted in Q4 2025.
