19. <u>21-1180</u> Home in Tacoma Project proposed amendments review.

Brian Boudet, Planning Division Manager, Planning and Development Services, presented on the Home in Tacoma Project, including the purpose; Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee's recommended mid-scale map; and a summary and review of the 15 potential amendments, noting which Council Member brought the amendment forward, and what type of change is proposed.

Mayor Woodards stated a special meeting will be held next week to discuss the amendments, and that final reading of Ordinance No. 28793, regarding the Home in Tacoma Project, will be continued from the Tuesday, November 30, 2021, City Council meeting, to the Tuesday, December 7, 2021, City Council meeting. She further stated the amendments will be posted on the City's website at cityoftacoma.org/homeintacoma, and if there are any further amendments, Council Members should provide them to staff by the end of the business day tomorrow.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee

Council Member McCarthy, Chair of the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, reported at the October 27, 2021, meeting, the Committee received presentations on the Brewery Blocks place naming designation, the electric vehicle action plan, and the Home in Tacoma Project; at the November 10, 2021, meeting, the Committee received a presentation on food-producing trees in the right-of-way and tree protection; and at the November 17, 2021, special meeting, the Committee received presentations on the Vision Zero action plan and speed reduction study, and updates to the floodplain management code. He concluded by stating the November 24, 2021, meeting, has been cancelled, and the next meeting will be held on December 8, 2021, at 4:30 p.m., through Zoom, and will include interviews for the Planning Commission.

Mayor Woodards provided information on COVID-19 vaccine boosters, including the eligibility age, the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department's (TPCHD) recommendation, and where to get help to schedule the booster shot; she further provided information on age eligibility for the COVID-19 vaccine, and COVID-19 case and hospitalization rates. She concluded by stating that after a 20-month unified command with the Pierce County Department of Emergency Management, the unified command will be dissolved on November 23, 2021; and that the TPCHD continues the response and recovery effort under the Federal Emergency Management Agency's emergency support function and as a public health lead for the emergency response of COVID-19.
