- Request authority for the City Manager to commit up to \$500,000 in local repaid UDAG funds as a match to an i6 Challenge Grant
- City match activity would be acquisition of 2304 Jefferson Avenue if grant is awarded
- University of Washington-Tacoma is grant applicant

Background

- Purpose is to form a biotech/healthfocused accelerator with access to UWT, Madigan Army Medical Center and MultiCare
- Foster a vibrant and diverse economy with good jobs for all Tacoma residents

Issues

- Tacoma has limited entrepreneurship in biotech and health
- Vision 2025
 - Diversify the economy
 - Increase the number of living wage jobs
- 2016 City Manager Initiative: encourage growth of the biotech industry

Issues continued

- Health-focused entrepreneurs face cost/time barriers to clinical trials to prove innovation concepts
 - Puget Sound Life Science incubators/accelerators - King County
 - Less than 5% vacancy/rent \$45/ft+
 - Two hours drive from Madigan & MultiCare
- Madigan and MultiCare have data from 500,000 patients
- Testing ideas against this data speeds up innovation



Proposed Structure

- City acts as landlord
- Non-profit organizes, funds, manages
- City acquisition is contingent on organization formation and capability
 - Funding and company recruitment
