SUMMARY:

Appointing and re-appointing the following individuals to the Landmarks Preservation Commission: Lysa Schloesser to the “Architect” No. 1 designation to serve a three-year term to expire December 31, 2017; Eugene Thorne to the “At-large” No. 2 designation to fill an unexpired term expiring December 31, 2015; and Laureen Skrivan to the “Professional” No. 4 designation to fill an unexpired term expiring December 31, 2015.

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

As the Commission oversees the establishment and regulation of landmarks, local historic districts, proposed name changes for public facilities, and certain property tax incentives, appointing and reappointing individuals to the Commission best aligns with the strategic policy priority to foster neighborhood, community, and economic development vitality and sustainability.

BACKGROUND:

At the November 17, 2014 Neighborhoods and Housing Committee meeting, the Committee interviewed applicants and recommended the appointment and reappointment of the individuals listed above.

ISSUE:

Four positions need to be filled on the Landmarks Preservation Commission.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Commission would operate without full membership.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Neighborhoods and Housing Committee is recommending the appointment and reappointment of the individuals listed above.
