SUBJECT: Ordinance – Approve the EMS Tax Levy – November 9, 2021
DATE: October 19, 2021

SUMMARY:

The City of Tacoma is required by state law to annually approve the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) levy on property taxes. Staff recommends that the City Council set the amount of revenue from the EMS property tax levy at \$11,787,156.

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

- Encourage and promote an efficient and effective government, which is fiscally sustainable and guided by engaged residents.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to RCW 84.52.020 and RCW 84.52.070, the City of Tacoma must pass an ordinance that identifies the estimated revenues raised by taxation on the assessed valuation of the property in the city.

ISSUE:

The City of Tacoma must take two actions to set the EMS property tax levy for 2022:

- Approve the total EMS levy amount to be collected – State law requires that the City adopt an ordinance that states how much in property taxes the City is requesting to collect in 2022.
- Approve the percentage and dollar increase over the prior year’s actual EMS levy – State law requires that the City Council approve a separate ordinance or resolution that states the percentage and dollar increase of this year’s levy request over the prior year’s actual levy. This action establishes the City’s highest allowable levy amount.

The City has the authority to increase the total EMS levy amount to \$11,787,156 in 2022. The 2022 property tax levy estimate does not include new construction.

The City anticipates that it can collect an additional \$150,569 due to the value of new construction and improvements with no refund levy. The total estimated property tax of \$11,937,725 is consistent with the property tax projected in the 2021-2022 Proposed Budget. Jurisdictions with populations of 10,000 or greater are limited to increasing the City’s levy by the lower of 1% or the rate of inflation. The implicit price deflator, used to measure inflation, is 1%.

ALTERNATIVES:

Pursuant to RCW 84.52.020 and RCW 84.52.070 the City of Tacoma is required to pass an ordinance to set the amount of revenue from the EMS property tax levy; therefore, staff has not identified an alternative.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the ordinance to set the estimated amount of revenue from the EMS property tax levy at \$11,787,156.



FISCAL IMPACT:

EMS property tax of \$11,787,156 is consistent with the property tax projected in the 2021-2022 Proposed Budget. With new construction and refunds, property tax is estimated at \$11,937,725 which is consistent with the property tax projected in the 2021-2022 Proposed Budget. In 2022, staff anticipated property tax revenues to be approximately \$11.6 million due to historical collection rates of 97.5%.
