Call to Order

Mayor Strickland called the study session to order at 12:05 p.m.

Briefing Items

1. <u>15-0519</u> Legislative Update

At approximately 12:05 p.m., Randy Lewis, Government Relations Officer, presented a legislative update that included the status of City issues of interest including, the Bay Street speed camera, and transportation revenue proposals.

Council Member Thoms arrived here, at 12:08 p.m.

Discussion ensued regarding sales tax revenue relative to Sound Transit.

Council Members Campbell and Ibsen arrived here, at 12:11 p.m.

Mr. Lewis continued reviewing legislative bills, including police body cameras, restoring resources to the Capital Budget, Operating Budget, marijuana revenue, and marijuana policy. Mr. Lewis concluded by presenting a map produced by the Association of Washington Cities showing locations of marijuana stores, and reviewed a calendar of upcoming legislative dates.

Mayor Strickland stated that the new Pierce Transit Chief Executive Officer (CEO) has started, and Sound Transit will begin searching for a new CEO as well.

Defiance Zoo will have a new jellyfish exhibit, Jammin' with Jellies, which is now open daily for public viewing. He stated that he had the opportunity to represent the City of Tacoma in China, and gave an update on a discussion regarding a pavillion in our free trade zone located in our Sister City of Fuzhou, China.
