Dear Mayor and Council Members:

ITEMS OF INTEREST

- 1. The Human Resources Department provides the attached **April 2023**, **staffing report** for the **Tacoma Police Department**.
- 2. Public Works Interim Director Josh Diekmann provides the attached **Public Works Engineering Capital Projects report.**
- 3. The City of Tacoma's Planning and Development Services Long-Range Planning team earned an Excellence in Planning Award in the category of implementation for the McKinley Hill Neighborhood Plan from the American Planning Association (APA) and the Planning Association of Washington (PAW). The award was presented on April 27, 2023, at the annual PAW conference in Chelan, Washington.

The plan was developed in partnership with the McKinley Hill neighbors and businesses after more than a year of community engagement, including steering groups, committees, surveys, community events and action mapping. The plan outlines specific goals, recommendations, and actions for the City and its partners to support implementation of the community's vision of the future of McKinley Hill. These actions are outlined in the recently adopted McKinley Hill Neighborhood Plan document, which is available at cityoftacoma.org/McKinleyNP.

- 6. <u>City-funded Temporary and Emergency Shelter Performance</u>: The City posts weekly information about its Temporary and Emergency Shelter locations including current census, number of available beds and exits to housing. This information can be found at: https://www.cityoftacoma.org/UserFiles/Servers/Server-6/File/cms/NCS/City%20Authorized%20Emergency%20Shelter%20Sites/Weeklydataupdate.pdf and is updated weekly.

- 7. Encampment Outreach: The City's Homeless Engagement and Alternatives Liaison (HEAL)
 Team (formerly the Homeless Outreach Team) performs encampment outreach throughout the
 week to provide individuals opportunities to connect to shelter, behavioral health, substance
 use and employment services. For the week of April 17 21, 2023, staff visited eighteen
 locations. This resulted in fifty three individuals being contacted and referred to
 community services and nine individuals accepting shelter.
- 8. Holy Rosary Safe Parking Site: The safe parking site at Holy Rosary operated by Catholic Community Services (CCS) opened on Monday, April, 2023. Site referrals are made through the City's Homeless Engagement and Alternatives Liaison (HEAL) team as well as our contracted partners, Comprehensive Life Resources and Tacoma Rescue Mission Search and Rescue. CCS expects to be serving 11 individuals on site by the close of business April 26, 2023. Since opening last week, CCS has already had a positive outcome, connecting one individual to permanent housing. As a reminder, the site is expected to serve up to 40 individuals and/or up to 20 vehicles and expected to provide access to hygiene services such as bathroom, showers, and laundry for residents who are staying on site. The residents will also have access to Case Management to assist with permanent housing solutions. - 9. Emergency Rental Assistance: The Pierce County Rental Assistance program stopped on August 1, 2022, however; applications will be processed normally until all funds have been distributed, this includes both Pierce County and City of Tacoma funds. This closure will not affect applications already in process. Since 2021, the City has provided 1,188 households with \$8,770,562 in rental assistance (this is an increase of 15 households and \$86,717, in assistance over last report). The City has now fully expended its ERA 1 award and its set aside for utility assistance from ERA 2 funds. When we launched this program in 2020, we set a goal of having at least 45% of the households served headed by a person of color, to date, 65% of the households served are headed by a person of color. The City's Rental Assistance Fund at the Greater Tacoma Community Foundation has received 32 gifts totaling \$33,380.

On our second agenda item, **staff will highlight the efforts of the Tacoma Anchor Network** (TAN). Comprised of most of the largest employers in Tacoma, the Network focuses on creating a resilient local economy by using their collective purchasing power to buy local, their collective hiring power to hire local, and by making collaborative place-based investments.



The Public Works Department is pleased to provide the attached update to our capital projects planning document. The purpose of this document is to provide additional information regarding funding, costs, and schedules for active capital projects within Public Works. Updates include changes to project schedules and funding, the addition of new projects, and deletion of projects that are complete. The document lists projects in categories according to work phase with projects in design listed first, followed by projects in advertisement, construction, and closeout. The update also includes Public Works support services for Tacoma Rail projects, Neighborhood and Community Services projects, Community and Economic Development projects, and others.

This project list is a result of the residents of Tacoma approving the Streets Initiative (Proposition No. 3 and Transportation Benefit District Proposition A) in November 2015 to fund additional maintenance and improvements to transportation infrastructure. The project funding sources include Propositions A and No. 3, other City funds, grants, gas tax, and City utility funds. Several of the projects are currently funded for design only with construction funding sources to be determined.

Please note this is a planning document that is subject to change as new funding becomes available and as progress is made on capital projects, whether it be in design and/or construction. Staff's objective is to provide the City Council with a solid grounding on these topics in advance of upcoming in-person public meetings.
