## **Briefing Item**

1. <u>22-0939</u> Growing Resilience Program Update

At approximately 12:01 p.m., Dona Ponepinto, President and CEO, United Way of Pierce County (UWPC) provided opening remarks regarding the Growing Resilience In Tacoma (GRIT) program.

Council Member Daniels arrived here, at 12:03 p.m.

Ponepinto introduced Abigail Lawson, Program Director for GRIT, and Dr. Jarrett Brunny, Vice President of Community Impact, UWPC. Lawson presented on the GRIT program, including participants, noting that all are Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE), single income earner households with children, who reside in specific zip codes; recipient demographics; other programming information, noting funds disbursed, invitations for participants to engage in surveys and interviews, the offboarding process and timeline, benefits counseling, and modeling a continuation of the program; work to change narratives about financial safety nets and guaranteed income; advocacy efforts; and example stories from

participants. Brunny concluded by expressing appreciation for steering committee members, partner agencies, and donors.

Discussion ensued regarding appreciation for staff; the focus on ALICE families; Tacoma's role as a leader in guaranteed income programs, noting national recognition and requests from other cities to help set up their programs; the final report format and future presentations; how the City Council can support ongoing work; changing perceptions about unconditional support, noting stigma, guilt, communicating facts, and sharing individuals' stories; impacts of poverty on health and well-being; additional studies and data gathering, noting qualitative data, crime statistics, interviews, and reassessments; possibility of expanding the program; the importance of donations and volunteers; providing stability and reducing barriers; state and federal level advocacy; ensuring guaranteed income does not conflict with other benefits programs; funding sources; reducing displacement; supporting child care programs; and recognizing that poverty is a systemic, and not a personal, failure.
