SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

An ordinance vacating a 16-foot-wide alley lying southerly of vacated South 30th Street and northerly of South Tacoma Way and lying between South Wilkeson Street and vacated South Ash Street with the intention of addressing and eliminating existing building and industrial storage use encroachments.

BACKGROUND:

The Hearing Examiner's recommendation is based on the evidence and testimony presented as part of a public hearing held on August 22, 2024. The Vacation Area (as defined by the Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation) is a 16-foot-wide alley lying southerly of vacated South 30th Street and northerly of South Tacoma Way, and lying between South Wilkeson Street and vacated South Ash Street. Petitioner, Bradken, Inc., requested the vacation intending to address and eliminate existing building and industrial storage use encroachments. Given the accompanying privatization of an existing sewer line in the Vacation Area, and the isolated location, the Vacation Area is not contemplated or needed for future public use.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:

A public hearing was held on this petition on August 22, 2024, at which members of the community could attend and speak to express their concerns, opposition, and/or support for the proposed vacation. No members of the public were in attendance. The vacation will benefit the Petitioner by allowing the Vacation Area to be used for existing building and industrial storage. There are no foreseeable negative effects on the community related to the requested vacation.

2025 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW UP:

The recommended vacation is subject to the conditions listed in Conclusion 8 of the Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation, issued on September 18, 2024. All evaluations and follow-up should be coordinated between the Petitioner and the appropriate City departments referenced in the Report and Recommendation.

STAFF/SPONSOR RECOMMENDATION:

The Hearing Examiner recommends approval of the requested vacation subject to the conditions contained in Conclusion 8 of the Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The potential fiscal impact of this street vacation is not known at this time. If the vacation is approved, a fair market appraisal or a market rate analysis for the area to be vacated will be conducted after first reading of the ordinance. The Petitioner will be required to pay the City such market value amount as a condition to the right-of-way vacation being finalized. In addition, if the vacation is finalized, the vacated area will be added to the taxable square-footage of the abutting real property, thereby possibly generating additional ongoing property tax income.
