1. **The City Council will hold a special meeting on Friday, April 18, 2025, at 8:00 a.m., to convene to an Executive Session to evaluate qualifications of an applicant for public employment.**

5. **Electric Vehicle Charging Stations Celebration: The City and Tacoma Public Utilities are holding a celebratory plugging-in event that will occur on Tuesday, April 22, 2025, at 9:15 a.m., in the Tacoma Municipal Lot (located at 728 Market Street., across the from Tacoma Municipal Building North.)** The event will feature two of the new Fast charging stations.

This Downtown EV Charging Expansion Project has nearly doubled the number of EV chargers available, with 34 new chargers installed across 7 City-operated parking lots and garages. For the first time, fast charging is also available at two convenient locations near I-705. By increasing the total number of chargers downtown to 64, including 58 Level 2 chargers and 4 Level 3 DC Fast Chargers, the project makes electric transportation more accessible to residents, visitors, and businesses.

The new chargers are strategically located to provide broader coverage and access for EV drivers. The new chargers were funded by a Washington State Department of Commerce Electrification of Transportation Systems Program grant, along with support from the Puget Sound Clean Air Agency and the Washington Clean Fuel Standard credit revenue.

 - Resolution U-11525 – Authorize execution of a letter of agreement as negotiated with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local 483, Water Division Unit, regarding the water treatment plan operator-in-training. **To Council May 6, 2025.**
7. Temporary and Emergency Shelter Performance: **The City posts weekly updates and information about its Temporary and Emergency Shelter locations including current census, number of available beds, and exits to housing.** Updates are reported weekly, and this information can be found at: https://cityoftacoma.org/UserFiles/Servers/Server_6/File/NCS/weeklydataupdate.pdf.
8. Alzheimer Memorial Church, Give Me A Chance, Shelter Standdown: **The family shelter (1121 South Alzheimer Street), operated by Alzheimer Memorial Church (Alzheimer), is currently preparing to standdown.** Alzheimer staff will continue to work with the current families on their stability and housing plans during this transition and into permanent housing or other temporary solutions by **June 30, 2025**. Since opening in February 2020, the shelter has served 239 individuals, with 148 of the clients have confirmed being connected to permanent housing.

On April 13, 2025, there were 36 residents at the site and every household is currently working with case management. Neighborhood and Community Services is meeting with Alzheimer weekly to assess operational needs and will continue to support the shelter during this transition. **The City is committed to ensuring that every resident has the option to transition to the new location or has an alternative shelter location should they wish by or before June 30, 2025.**
9. Encampment Outreach: For the week of **April 7 – 11, 2025**, the City's Homeless Engagement and Alternatives Liaison (HEAL) team visited **18 locations**. This resulted in **22 (13 new, and 9 repeat)** individuals contacted and referred to community services; **3 individuals** was placed in shelter. 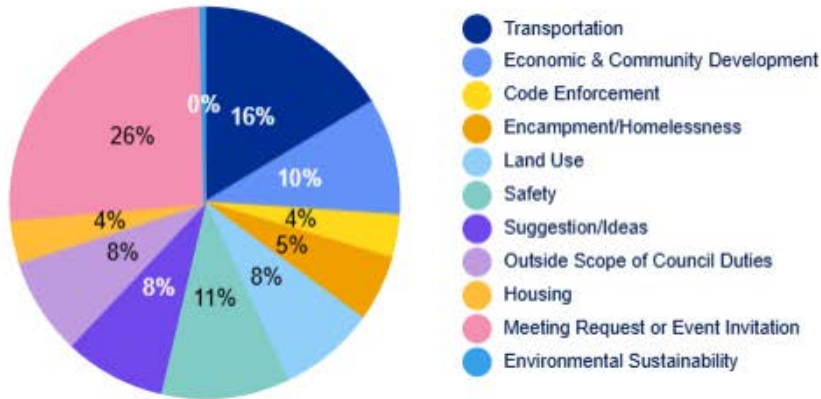

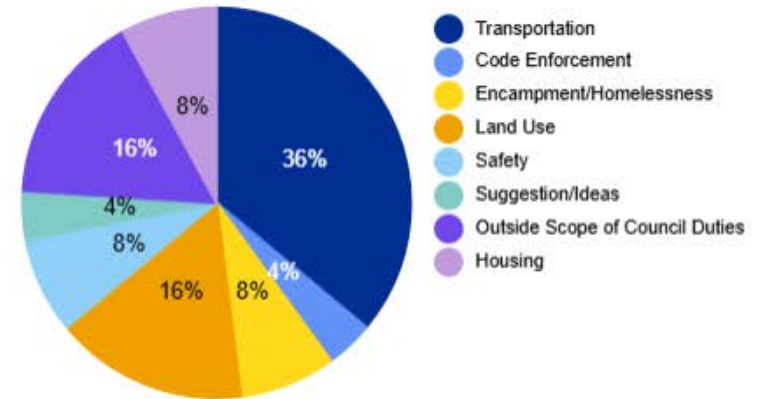

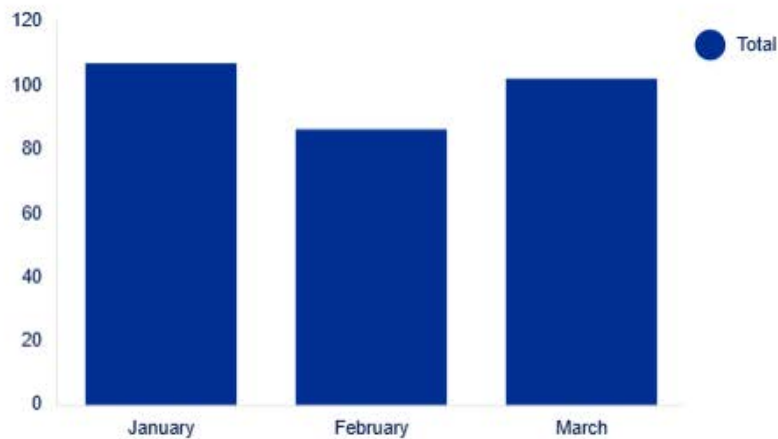

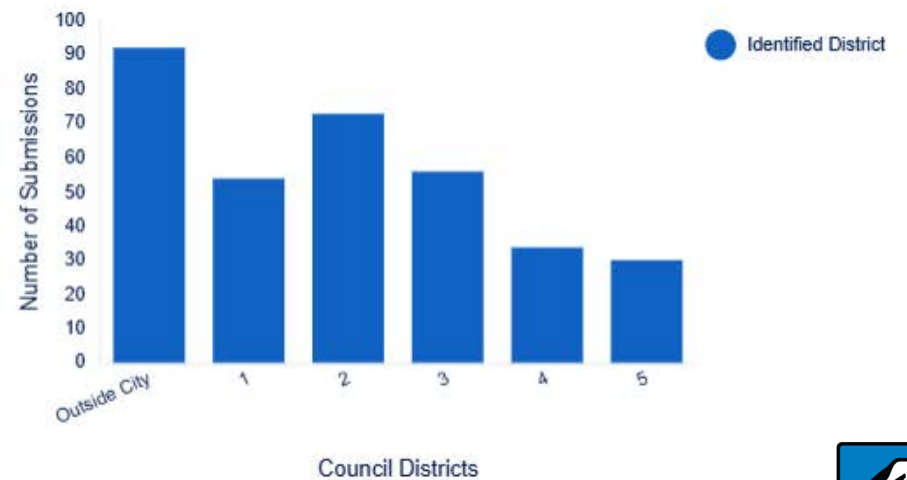


Submission Summary
