REPORTS BY THE CITY MANAGER

City Manager T.C. Broadnax stated on November 9, 2016, there will be a design charrette and a public open house on the Puyallup Avenue Corridor Project, held at the LaQuinta Inn & Conference Center, noting the project is meant to enhance the experience along the corridor for pedestrians, cyclists, drivers and transit riders. He then reported the Tacoma Police Department was awarded its second reaccreditation from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA), and the department has been accredited since 2010. He noted this is a great accomplishment as only a small percentage of law enforcement organizations are accredited nationally.

Community Vitality and Safety Committee

Council Member Woodards, Chair of the Community Vitality and Safety Committee, stated on October 13, 2016, the Committee was briefed on 2017-2018 human services sustained contracts and on October 17, 2016, held a special meeting to conduct interviews for the Hilltop Community Engagement Group. Finally, she stated on October 27, 2016 the Committee was briefed on the 2017-2018 human services funding recommendations as approved by the Human Services Commission, which included a combination of Mental Health Substance Use Disorder Funds and general funds for a total investment of \$7.1 million. Chair Woodards stated the next meeting will be December 8, 2016 at 4:30 p.m. to conduct interviews for positions on the Human Rights Commission and the Tacoma Area Commission on Disabilities.
