SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

A resolution authorizing a Council Contingency Fund expenditure of \$2,500 to sponsor the City's 2023 Juneteenth Celebration.

COUNCIL SPONSORS:

Mayor Victoria Woodards, Council Member Keith Blocker, and Council Member Kiara Daniels

BACKGROUND:

The City of Tacoma recognized the Juneteenth holiday for employees in 2022 and we held our first community celebration and inauguration of the Black Lives Matter mural at Tollefson Plaza.

The City of Tacoma Human Rights Commission recognizes that the celebration of Juneteenth offers our community the opportunity to reflect on the grievous and ongoing legacy of slavery and rededicate ourselves to rooting out the systemic racism that continues to plague our communities.

Juneteenth commemorates the events of June 19th, 1865, when Major General Gordon Granger led Union soldiers into Galveston, Texas, bringing news that the Civil War had ended and that the Emancipation Proclamation had declared all enslaved people free nearly two and a half years earlier.

Juneteenth not only reminds us that our history remains stained by injustice but calls us to action to build a future for all of our children where systemic inequities that have created barriers for them no longer exist. Our country, and the City of Tacoma, cannot afford to repeat our past offenses that generated beliefs, policies and systems that were and are discriminatory, immoral, and inhumane.

The celebration of Juneteenth matters as a celebration of the liberation from beliefs, policies and systems that were and are discriminatory, immoral, and inhumane. It represents resistance, resilience, and Black Joy. Through this event, the City of Tacoma encourages our residents to reflect on the themes of Black and African American Liberation, Healing, and transformation for our city.

Funding will support painting supplies for the mural, advertising, dancing, music, performers, and speakers, as well as tables and chairs needed for the community fair.

The event will feature a number of activities, including:

- An interactive Black Lives Matter mural handprint activity
- A community resource fair
- Spoken word and dance performances
- Food available for purchase from a local food vendor



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The Tacoma Art Museum is also hosting its "Free Thursday Neighborhood Night" during this event. A printed tour guide highlighting Black artists on view, curated by Victoria Miles, The Current's Artist Award Manager, will be available for museum visitors.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:

The City's Human Rights Commission was established to study and investigate problems of prejudice, bigotry, and discrimination and to encourage and coordinate the implementation of programs consistent with the needs and the rights of all residents of the City of Tacoma. The Commission has been a leader in pushing for this event and advocated for Council support to host this event this year.

2025 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

Equity and Accessibility:

This free family friendly event and celebration of Juneteenth will happen in front of the Black Lives Matter Mural, and be surrounded by speakers, resources, and a community Fair with local organizations represented. The event will provide inspiration, history, and opportunities to engage in solutions in addressing systemic inequities.

Explain how your legislation will affect the selected indicator(s)?

History and sharing the knowledge of Juneteenth is vital to furthering understanding and equity in Tacoma. Through shared understanding and conversation, we can understand our past and ensure we do not repeat these vile actions in the future. It also brings to light the continued systemic oppression of black and brown communities and provides resources and information for people to engage in solutions.
