- 5. <u>Neighborhood Council Review Engagement</u>: The City of Tacoma's Neighborhood Council Program is undergoing its five-year review and **is currently collecting feedback**. There are eight Neighborhood Councils and one overarching Community Council that support Tacoma's diverse communities and engages with City staff on neighborhood issues, concerns, and priorities identified by community members.

The Neighborhood Council Program aims to create an environment in which community members have an opportunity to:

- Meaningfully discuss City programs and policies that affect their neighborhoods.
- Bring neighborhood concerns, priorities, and goals to the attention of the City.
- Encourage diverse relationships and representative participation where residents feel they positively impact and improve the livability of their communities.

<u>Take the online survey</u> by August 31 to provide feedback that will help inform the updates to the Neighborhood Council Program <u>Standards and Guidelines</u> and <u>Tacoma Municipal Code 1.45</u>. - 6. Encampment Outreach: The City's Homeless Engagement and Alternatives Liaison Team (formerly the Homeless Outreach Team) performs encampment outreach throughout the week to provide individuals opportunities to connect to shelter, behavioral health, substance use, and employment services. For the week of July 22 26, 2024, staff visited 15 locations. This resulted in 124 (60 new, and 64 repeat) individuals being contacted and referred to community services. Three individuals accepted shelter.
- 7. <u>Inclement Weather Response Plan</u>: For the 2024 summer inclement weather season for heat and smoke, the City of Tacoma is partnering with Tacoma Libraries, outreach teams (contracted and non-contracted), and volunteers to ensure that unsheltered individuals have access to water and masks, information about cooling centers, and sheltering throughout the City. The City has ensured that there is sufficient water available at the stability site for pickup and that our partners are prepared to supply resources accordingly.

Thresholds for inclement weather activations:

- **85 degrees or higher and/or Air Quality over 101**, the City will supply both unsheltered and sheltered individuals with water and masks depending on need.
- For 90 degrees or higher and/or Air Quality over 151, the City will continue to supply resources, open cooling, and air quality centers for daytime relief and/or possible nighttime relief for smoke. The City pauses non-emergent encampment removals from public property and City rights-of-way during inclement weather events that meet this threshold.

The City is working with other providers to expand shelter capacity during acute inclement weather events. When temperatures reach the threshold of 85 degrees an additional (total) beds will be made available as listed below:

- Catholic Community Services' Nativity House (702 South 14th Street) will be providing an additional 80 overflow shelter beds.
- Valeo Vocation will be providing 20 overflow beds for young adults 18-24 years of age at the Beacon Young Adult Shelter (415 South 13th Street).

SUBJECT: July 2024 Neighborhood Council Liaison Report

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this memo is to provide a summary of topics and concerns discussed at the eight Neighborhood Councils and the Community Council of Tacoma during the month of July 2024. These items have been identified by the City Manager's Office liaison to each council as important or useful to bring to the City Council and City Manager's attention.

TOPICS AND CONCERNS:

Central Tacoma Neighborhood Council

The Central Neighborhood Council did not meet in July 2024.

Community Council of Tacoma

The Community Council of Tacoma met on July 24th. Councilmember Sadalge and approximately 13 CCoT members attended this meeting. Representatives from the Attorney General's HearMeWA.org campaign provided information about this youth-focused service.

Other topics included homelessness, housing affordability, and charter review.

East Side Neighborhood Council

The East Side Neighborhood Council met virtually on July 23rd and approximately 20 members were in attendance. The group expressed appreciation for Mayor Woodards, Council Member Daniels, and Council Member Bushnell attending the litter clean-up event at Catherine Ushka's Gas Station Park; the Council expressed a desire to continue collaborating with councilmembers on clean-up events.

A representative from Sound Thinking, who operate Shot Spotter, delivered a presentation about the technology. Attendees asked if Tacoma's adoption of Shot Spotter would create any local jobs. A number of community members expressed strong support for the technology and asked if it could be implemented in the eastside. Community members appreciated the City's FAQ sheet and noted that it addressed key questions.



New Tacoma Neighborhood Council

The New Tacoma Neighborhood Council met on July 10, 2024. The meeting was held virtually due to the ongoing power outage at UW - Tacoma. Councilmember Rumbaugh and approximately six community members attended the meeting.

Pierce Transit delivered a presentation about the Tacoma Dome Light Rail Extension. Attendees requested 311 data specific to the New Tacoma Neighborhood Council district.

North End Neighborhood Council

The North End Neighborhood Council held a hybrid meeting on July 1st. Councilmember Rumbaugh, Deputy Mayor Hines, and approximately 20 community members attended the meeting. Tacoma Public Utilities and Planning and Development Services gave a presentation on the Cushman and Adams Substations Future Use Study.

The Neighborhood Council Chair flagged that the Council is joining a legal challenge to the historic district moratorium. Additional topics included litter, fireworks, and 311.

Northeast Tacoma Neighborhood Council

The Northeast Tacoma Neighborhood Council did not meet in July 2024.

South End Neighborhood Council

The South End Neighborhood Council met on July 1st. Councilmember Bushnell and approximately 17 community members attended the meeting. Neighborhood and Community Services Director Allyson Griffith, executive liaison for the South End Neighborhood Council, shared news from NCS specifically relevant to the South End. Attendees also discussed updates to the NCS Standards and Guidelines Review.

Other topics included fireworks, Safe Streets, the Healthy Hosmer Initiative RFP, and the South End Coalition.

South Tacoma Neighborhood Council

The South Tacoma Neighborhood Council held a hybrid meeting on July 17th. Councilmember Bushnell and approximately 15 community members attended this meeting. Washington Speaker of the House Laurie Jinkins delivered a presentation summarizing the 2024 legislative session. She highlighted policy accomplishments in the areas of housing, childcare, behavioral health/fentanyl crisis response, climate and environment, and community safety.

Councilmember Bushnell reported on recent and upcoming Council activities: Home in Tacoma, charter review, Urban Design Board, the new District 4 council member, and upcoming budget development.

The Pierce Transit liaison announced that they were conducting a community survey to gather input as they create their long-term plans. The liaison encouraged attendees to participate in the survey and provided information on how the survey can be accessed.



West End Neighborhood Council

The West End Neighborhood Council met on July 10th. Councilmember Walker and approximately 15 community members attended the meeting. The liaison from the Tacoma Police Department fielded questions about illegal street racing and illegal parking. The liaison told attendees that the Department struggles to issue citations for July 4th fireworks violations due to their shortage of officers.

Metro Parks provided an overview of the City in a Park Strategic Plan. Pierce Transit delivered a presentation on their major projects including the Tacoma Light Rail Extension and their 2045 Long Range Plan.
