# Overview and Purpose of CFP

- WA State Growth Management Act and Tacoma Municipal Code require CFP be prepared and updated periodically
- CFP covers a six-year planning period
- Planning tool (does not appropriate funds)
- With Planning Commission's concurrence,
   CFP moves forward to be adopted along with the City's biennial budget



# Project Selection

- Factors considered when selecting projects for inclusion:
  - Assessment of need
  - Financing/Funding Capacity
  - Community outreach and input
  - Consistency and connection with Tacoma's Comprehensive Plan (Comp Plan Tie-In Questions)


