City Manager T.C. Broadnax reported on pet license amnesty month, noting this is a chance to avoid all late fees. He noted that licensing pets improves public safety and it's the law. He then acknowledged Mayor Strickland's birthday on September 25, 2013.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Public Safety, Human Services, and Education Committee

Chair Woodards stated the Committee has met twice since the last report. She stated on August 8, 2013, the Committee heard an update from the United Way of Pierce County on their new funding priorities and strategic plan, including their emphasis on prevention through early childhood development. She stated the Committee also had an informational briefing from the Tacoma Police Department on their Child Abduction Response Team certification process, including the certification timeline, standards and assessment; and received a briefing from the Human Rights Division on their complaints investigation process, including discrimination trends in employment, housing and public accommodation. She stated on September 12, 2013, the Committee had an informational update from Metro Parks Tacoma on program changes to the SPARX program, which works in partnership with Tacoma Public Schools to deliver education, recreational and personal development programming in eight middle schools in Tacoma. She noted the Committee also heard from Tacoma Housing Authority on their educational programs, specifically the program which started in fall 2011 at McCarver Elementary School; and the Committee recommended the approval of a General Government Emergency Radio Replacement Contract, which is part of a digital upgrade to the City's analog radio system. She stated the next meeting will be held on October 10, 2013, and will include the Mental Health and Chemical Dependency program and the 2012-2013 State Gang Grant Performance Report.
