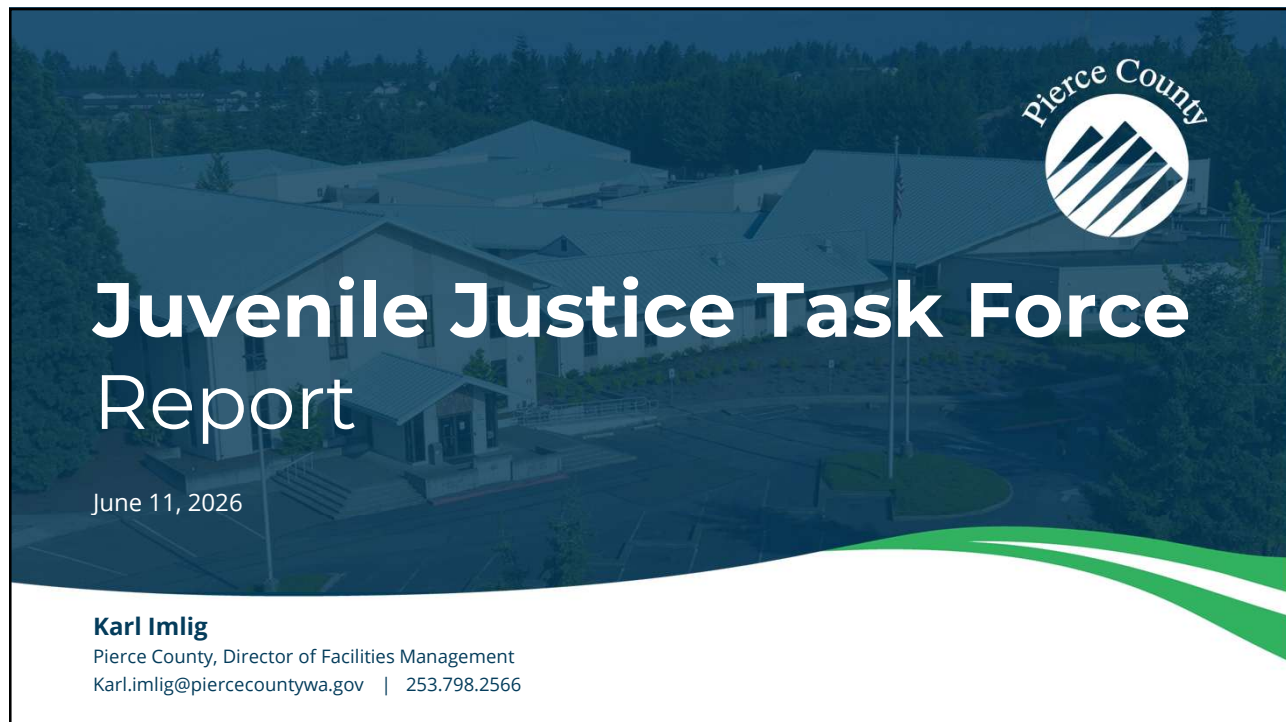

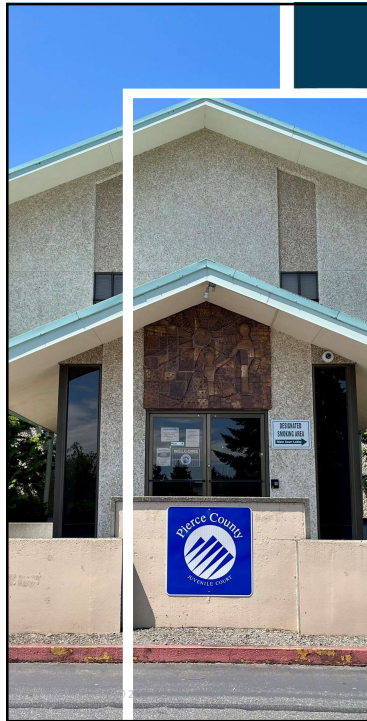

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Task Force Charge and Scope

- Develop recommendations for a **new juvenile justice facility** built around a modern approach to rehabilitation.
 - Reflect the **safety and programming needs** of today's young people.
 - Address the **purpose, function, and path forward** for the facility.
 - Recommendations are directional; focused on desired outcomes and priorities,
- The facility should be a **safe, healthy, and welcoming environment** for everyone who works in or visits it.
