# City of Tacoma

## General Government

### 2024 State Legislative Policy Priorities

**Emergency Shelter Operations:** The City asks for the state's partnership in preventing the closure of over 300 shelter beds. During the pandemic, the City faced an unprecedented homelessness crisis and invested American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds in shelters to house the region's most vulnerable. This investment saved lives. The City plans to transition those living in shelters to permanent supportive housing. However, the demand for shelter beds is far greater than originally anticipated and sufficient permanent supportive housing units are under development but not yet available. With the ARPA funds no longer available, the City needs the state's partnership to prevent the closure of these shelter beds.

**Fishing Wars Memorial Bridge:** The City requests the state's partnership to respond to the worsening condition of the Fishing Wars Memorial Bridge. The bridge provides freight mobility, emergency response, and access for the Port of Tacoma, the cities of Tacoma and Fife, and the Puyallup Tribe. The bridge is also a vital part of the bicycle and pedestrian network and is integral to the Tacoma to Puyallup Regional Trail Connection. Additionally, it provides an important bypass route when I-5 is blocked. The City was required to close the Bridge on October 20, 2023 as a result of the inability to complete inspections of the bridge due to an accumulation of debris preventing a full inspection, as full encapsulation of the bridge is required. The condition of the bridge continues to deteriorate and the bridge must be replaced. In 2019, the Phase 1 of the bridge replacement was completed and the City has received federal funding to begin design work for Phase 2. The City is continuing to seek funding for this critical work and, due to the closure of the bridge, the City is also seeking assistance to complete the cleaning necessary to permit the inspection necessary to reopen the bridge.

**Equitable and Structurally Sustainable Fiscal Structure:** The City asks the Legislature to correct a longstanding structural imbalance within city budgets as part of its ongoing effort to establish a sustainable, progressive, and equitable tax system. State law limits local property tax levy growth to 1%, while inflation and the costs to maintain services increase at a higher rate. This levy growth limit results in continual budget deficits that make it challenging to provide ongoing services to the community. The City also supports investments in programs, such as the

guaranteed basic income program, that aim to uplift those who have been negatively impacted by the state's historically regressive tax code.

**Climate Commitment Act Investments:** The City of Tacoma is strongly committed to the Climate Commitment Act (CCA) as a cornerstone of statewide climate strategy to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. The Tacoma City Council has passed resolutions declaring a climate emergency in Tacoma and calling for a transformative climate action plan, including restricting the use of natural gas and new fossil fuel for existing City buildings and future City capital investments. To further these objectives, the City has conducted a Municipal Facilities Decarbonization Study to identify and prioritize the implementation of projects to further the City's carbon reduction goals.

As the state's partner in addressing climate change, the City of Tacoma requests that the State allocate Climate Commitment Act funds directly to cities and to allocate CCA funds to projects and programs identified in the City's community-developed Climate Action Plan, allowing the funds to reduce greenhouse gas emissions efficiently and equitably in an environmentally just manner that uplifts those communities most impacted by climate change.

#### **Capital Funding:**

- The City supports the following MetroParks capital requests:
  - People's Community Center: \$400,000 to support a study of design concepts for the replacement of this 45-year-old building owned by the City of Tacoma and operated by Metro Parks. This is the oldest of the four active community centers and is functionally obsolete with failing systems.
  - South End Community Center: \$400,000 to support a feasibility study to consider the siting, program needs and design concepts for a new community center based in Southeast Tacoma. This is an under-served area of the city. The Park District will complete its update to the Metro Parks System and Strategic Plan in the spring, and that will shed more light on services needed in that part of the City. This study will focus on the facility needs.

Members of the Washington State Legislature:

We write to urge you to pass **SB 5770** to revise the arbitrary 1% property tax cap that has been in place for more than 20 years—over a generation. Due to this cap being lower than inflation, cities are struggling to keep up with rising costs of providing basic community services like police, fire, parks, and streets.

We ask you to support the modest increase to the cap in **SB 5770**. This proposal ties the property tax cap to population growth and inflation up to 3%, a modest change that is more reflective of the last decade's average 3% inflationary growth in the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

We understand the reluctance to act on taxes; however, our residents need city funding options to keep up with our growing communities' needs and rising costs for services. **SB 5770** provides a tool that would give elected city officials the ability to determine whether and when to use it for their community's best interests.

Without a change, local governments can't sustain public safety and other basic services to keep up with our residents' needs. In fact:

- **In 2001:** Cities had 1 employee to serve every **80** city residents; and
- **In 2022:** Cities had 1 employee to serve every **110** city residents.

For a generation, local governments have managed to find band-aid solutions to cover this structural deficit while being called on to do more with less—but we are at the tipping point.

Allowing local elected officials to raise their property tax revenues by up to 3% per year puts the decision-making power back into our communities. Local elected officials have a high rate of trust among their constituents, and they are immediately accountable to the voters. Legislative action on this issue in 2024 isn't an automatic tax increase. Instead, it allows for thoughtful local debate and discussion about what will work best for each city.

Now is the time for this change. Cities must continue to provide these important services and cannot wait another 20 years or shift the burden of finding a solution onto the next generation.

Please pass **SB 5770**.
