Economic Development Committee

He stated at the next meeting, the Committee is scheduled to hear a report on key financial indicators from the fourth quarter of 2013.

Council Member Campbell reminded all to clear out drains in advance of the upcoming heavy rain forecasts. He also explained that his recently shaved head is in solidarity for friends recently diagnosed with cancer.

Council Member Mello congratulated and thanked the City's Office of Sustainability and everyone who helped to make the South Sound Sustainability Expo a success.

Council Member Ibsen announced the ribbon-cutting for the new Alaska Credit Union opening at Westgate North this Friday.

Mayor Strickland shared that the Request for Proposal recently issued for a citywide strategic planning process comes directly from a recommendation made by the City's Fiscal Sustainability Task Force, that the City undertake an inclusive, long-term visioning exercise. She thanked in advance everyone who will take part in the process.
