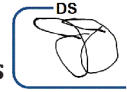

SUBJECT: Resolution – Setting Public Hearing Date for the Six-Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program – May 24, 2022
DATE: May 11, 2022



SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

A resolution setting Tuesday, June 7, 2022, at approximately 5:15 p.m., as the date for a public hearing before the City Council for the purpose of adopting the draft Six-Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program Amended 2022 and 2023-2028.

BACKGROUND:

This Department’s recommendation is based on Section 35.77.010 of the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) that provides that the legislative body of each city and town prepare and adopt a comprehensive transportation program for the ensuing six calendar years and annually thereafter pursuant to one or more public hearings, prepare and adopt a revised and extended comprehensive transportation program, and each one-year extension and revision thereof will be filed with the Secretary of Transportation of the State of Washington. Section 35.77.010 of the RCW further provides that each city will include in their comprehensive transportation program how they intend to expend the revenues for non-motorized transportation purposes.

The City adopted the Transportation Master Plan (TMP) in December 2015, which includes a prioritized list of transportation projects. The adoption of the TMP included extensive citywide community outreach, including attendance at neighborhood festivals and clean-ups, and two public hearings. The proposed list of projects to be added to the draft Program supports the goals and policies, as well as network priorities outlined in the TMP.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:

Staff provided a presentation to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee on the proposed list of projects to be added to, removed from, or consolidated with other projects in the draft program on March 23, 2022 and a presentation on the full draft program on April 27, 2022. Staff also provided a presentation to the Transportation Commission on the proposed list of projects to be added to, removed from, or consolidated with other projects in the draft program on March 16, 2022 and a presentation on the full draft program on April 20, 2022. Additionally, staff presented the proposed list of projects to be added to, removed from, or consolidated with other projects in the draft program at the May 10, 2022 City Council Study Session.

2025 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

Equity and Accessibility:

This resolution sets the date for a public hearing before the City Council. The public hearing provides residents with the opportunity to comment on planned transportation programs and projects that are vetted for consistency with the TMP, which includes mobility for all modes and abilities with active transportation as the priority.



Civic Engagement: *Equity Index Score: Moderate Opportunity*

Increase the percentage of residents who believe they are able to have a positive impact on the community and express trust in the public institutions in Tacoma.

A public hearing provides residents the opportunity to learn about and testify on the draft Six-Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program Amended 2022 and 2023-2028.

1. According to Section 35.77.010 of the RCW, the draft program must be adopted no later than July 1 st of each year. The public hearing can be scheduled for another date; however, that will delay adoption.	Delaying the adoption of the draft Six-Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program Amended 2022 and 2023-2028 would allow for the planning document to be more in alignment with current or proposed funding.	Delaying the adoption of the draft Six-Year Comprehensive Transportation Improvement Program Amended 2022 and 2023-2028 may result in the loss or delay of State and Federal grant funding, and project delivery.
