SUMMARY:

The Fire Department requests approval to accept a Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) grant in the amount of \$3,446,180 from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to pay salary and benefits costs of 20 firefighters for two years.

BACKGROUND:

The Fire Department submitted a grant application to the DHS for a SAFER grant to hire 20 firefighters to fill existing and pending vacancies. Without the grant funding, the positions were projected to remain vacant due to a prospective 2015–2016 General Fund budget shortfall. If accepted, the grant will reimburse the City for all non-overtime related wage and benefit costs for 20 firefighters for up to two years. The grant also includes a competitive opportunity to obtain funding for a third year for military veteran recruits.

ISSUE:

The City has thirty days from the date of award to acknowledge acceptance of the grant. Notice of the grant award was received Friday, January 24, 2014. The grant also includes a provision that states that grantees who lay off any firefighters during the period of the grant "will be considered in default of their grant and the award will be terminated."

ALTERNATIVES:

The Fire Department hopes to use the SAFER grant funding as a bridge to help retain current operational staffing while the City's General Fund revenues continue to recover during the next biennium. Alternatively, the department could be subjected to further reduction of emergency response units, position eliminations, and potential layoffs of personnel.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Fire Department recommends acceptance of the SAFER grant award and authorization to commence a fire recruit academy in the late first quarter of 2014.
