- Inclusion does not guarantee funding or completion








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



# SOUTH YAKIMA SIGNAL & SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS







Project Detail: This project upgraded existing traffic signal heads & phasing, installed Accessible Pedestrian Signals, and improved signal timing, communication and coordination, and included ADA improvements, as needed.

Funding: Streets Initiative \$112,300; Federal Grant \$1,010,400

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# REVITALIZING TACOMA'S BREWERY DISTRICT: PHASE I







Project Detail: This project includes Fawcett Ave between 6<sup>th</sup> Ave and S 19<sup>th</sup> Street. It includes adding a bike boulevard and bike lanes, including curb ramps, pedestrian refuge islands, upgraded crossing equipment, bicycle detection, Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS), mid-block crossings, traffic calming, and bicycle amenities.

Funding: Streets Initiative \$707,403; Real Estate Excise Tax \$320,000; Federal Grant \$2,414,774



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# LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS: LID 8663/8667 ALLEY & STREET






Project Detail: These projects received an adequate survey from owners on 6 streets and 1 alley in N Tacoma. They were created by Ordinance Nos. 28743 and 28749.

Funding: Streets Initiative \$1,958,780; Property Owner Contribution \$999,165; Utility Wastewater \$1,104,870; Utility Surface Water \$1,213,103
