- SM services.
 - Acute care treatment.
 - Treatment and referrals for chronic conditions.
 - Behavioral health care treatment and referrals.
- Wrap around services.

Street Medicine services

Clinical services:

- Wound care.
- Foot care.
- Other primary care.
- Testing for STI/HIV, Hep C, etc.
- Opioid use disorder treatment and referral.
- Mental health treatment and referral.

Street Medicine services

- Food.
- Hygiene kits.
- Socks, shoes, and other clothing.
- Warmers.
- Harm reduction.
- Community resources and connections.
- Bus passes to treatment.
- Referrals.

Outreach and vehicles

- Full deployment:
 - Launched May 26, 2025.
 - Mondays only until September.
 - Cargo van.
 - Narcan.
 - Hygiene kits.
 - Nutrition support.
 - Clothing.
 - Sleeping bags.
 - Converted Ram Coachmen:
 - Exam area.
 - Medical supplies.
- Mobile nurse care:
 - Launched April 22, 2025
 - RN and outreach worker in cargo van.
 - Wednesdays and Fridays.
 - Wound care.
 - Foot care.
 - Follow-up care from Monday deployments.

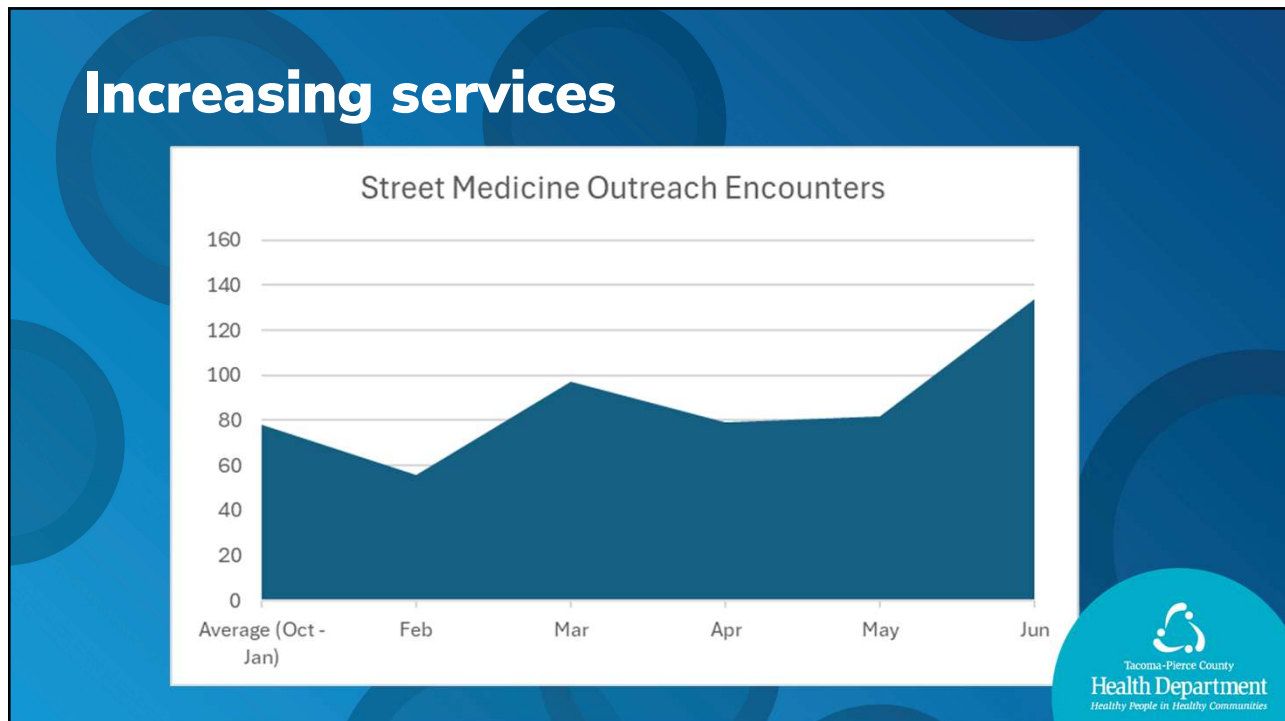


Increasing services

- October 2024–March 2025.
 - Peer support outreach.
- April–May 2025.
 - Weekly outreach with RN.
- Late June–August 2025.
 - Full deployments: 1/week.
 - Outreach with RN: 2/week.
- September 2025.
 - Full deployments: 3/week
- October 2025, going forward.
 - Full deployments: 4/weeks

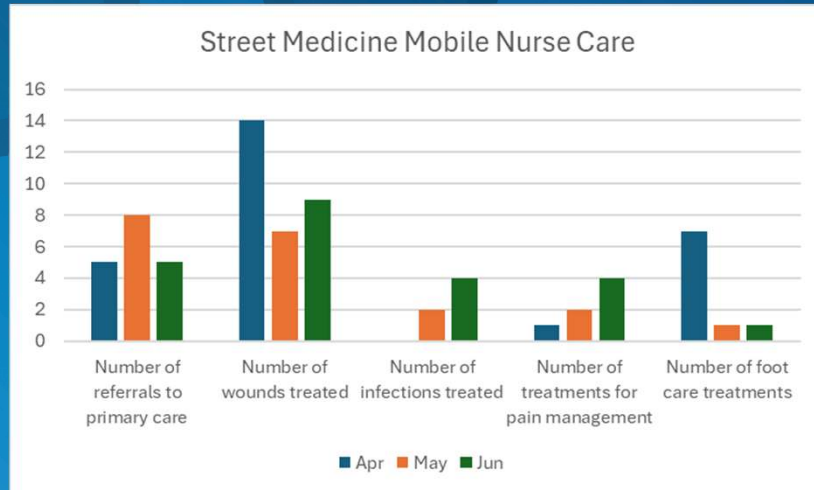


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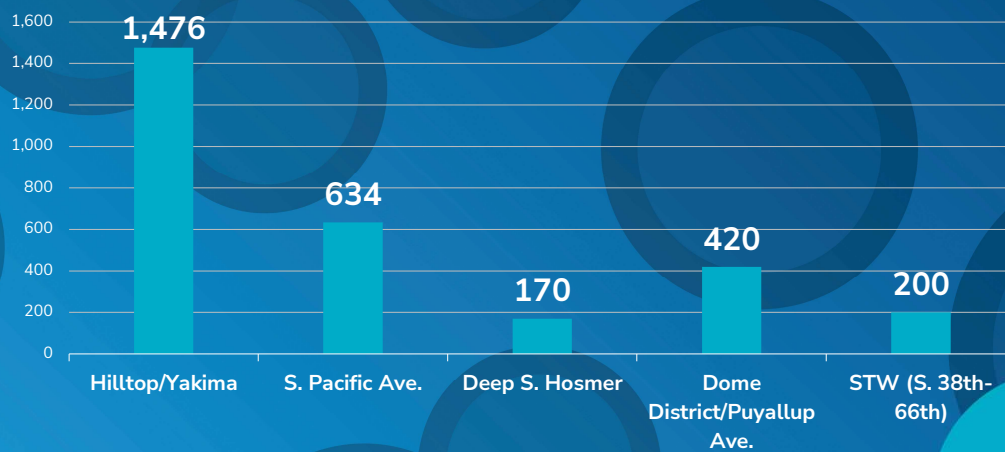

Outreach by the numbers

- Supply distribution.
 - Sleeping bags/blankets.
 - Socks/shoes.
 - Food/water.
 - Menstrual products.
 - Sunscreen.
- Hygiene kits distributed: 536.
- Naloxone kits distributed: 347.



Total people served: 760



MD/ARNP visits: 21



People served who have access to a phone: 20%



Most requested outreach kit: Hygiene supplies
