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	WHEREAS Chapter 39.34 RCW Interlocal Cooperation Act requires the		
1	authorization of each party's governing body to enter into the agreement, and		
2	Tacoma Power is seeking Public Utility Board approval prior to seeking City		
3 4	Council approval, and		
5	WHEREAS the budget proviso and contract for which this resolution		
6	seeks approval is:		
7	 \$350,000 of the climate commitment account – state appropriation 		
8	is provided solely for the authority to contract with Tacoma Power,		
9 10	to conduct a feasibility study, including scoping project costs, on		
11	pumped storage at Tacoma Power's Mossyrock Dam;		
12	The contract is exempt from the competitive procurement		
13	requirements in Chapter 39.26 RCW;		
14	 Funds may not be expended or obligated to January 1, 2025; and If Initiative Measure No. 2117 was approved in the general 		
15 16			
17	election, this subsection would have been null and void upon the		
18	effective date of the measure, however, the measure was not		
19	passed;		
20	Now, Therefore,		
21 22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUBLIC UTILITY BOARD OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:		
22	That an interlocal agreement between the City of Tacoma, by and		
24	through its Department of Public Utilities, Light Division and the Washington		
25	State Department of Commerce, for a pumped storage feasibility study at		
26	Mossyrock Dam, in the amount of \$339,500, budgeted from the State of		
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	Washington's Climate Commitment Account, with a 3% administration fee		
1	assessment, as part of the 2024 Integrated Resource Plan's two-year action		
2	plan, is approved, and the Council of the City of Tacoma is requested to concur		
3	in the approval and authorize the proper officers of the City to execute said		
4 5	agreement substantially in the form on file, with the final form approved by the		
6	City Attorney's Office.
