COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Economic Development Committee

Council Member Campbell, Chair of the Economic Development Committee, reported that at the May 10, 2016 meeting, the Committee received an update on the Economic Development Strategic Framework and Action Plan. He stated at the May 24, 2016 meeting, the Committee heard presentations on Accela permitting software, updates along the Foss Waterway, and the creation of a Biotech Accelerator; and at the June 14, 2016 meeting, the Committee heard a presentation on small business loan programs.

Government Performance and Finance Committee

Council Member Lonergan, Chair of the Government Performance and Finance Committee, reported that at the May 4, 2016 meeting, the Committee heard presentations on an interlocal agreement with the Yakima Consortium for Regional Public Safety for tracking of City inmates at Yakima jail facilities; an update on the Comprehensive Code Update Initiative to update and streamline the Municipal Code; and held interviews for the Board of Ethics. He stated at the May 18, 2016 meeting, the Committee heard a presentation on an interlocal agreement with the Metropolitan Park District of Tacoma, and held a joint meeting with the Audit Advisory Board to receive an audit results presentation from Moss Adams.
