Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee

Deputy Mayor Mello provided information on the 9th Annual South Sound Sustainability Expo on Saturday, March 5, 2016, at the Greater Tacoma Convention and Trade Center.

Council Member Blocker provided information on the next District No. 3 community newsletter, which will include a youth of the month and information on community organizations.
