- 6D Improve and maintain Tacoma's streets
- 7C Strengthen the City's fiscal sustainability

# **5.** <u>15-0199</u> 2015 Strategic Priorities

The City Council discussed and scored 2015 strategic objectives as follows:

- 1. Work with interested stakeholders to explore, review and identify potential sustainable funding sources to address the City's deferred street maintenance. (14 points; 3-3-3-2-2-1)
- 2. Establish and facilitate a Property Crimes Task Force to identify system improvements and strategies to reduce property crimes within the City. (10 points; 3-3-2-1-1)
- 3. Develop and implement a strategy to create citywide digital equity for residents by exploring options and leveraging Click! Network. (8 points; 3-2-1-1-1)
- 4. Develop the Tacoma 2025 Five-year Action Plan to successfully implement Tacoma 2025. (8 points; 3-2-2-1)
- 5. Develop and conduct a city-wide business satisfaction and business climate survey to identify opportunities to better understand local businesses' needs and areas of improvement on the City's behalf. (6 points; 3-3)
- 6. Continue to partner with Sound Transit to identify, secure and leverage funding to support the design and construction of the \$165 million Tacoma Link expansion. (5 points; 2-2-1).
- 7. Complete the design of streetscape improvements for the Lincoln Business District; engage business district property owners in discussion to identify potential options to support construction costs and other revitalization efforts. (2 points; 2)
- 8. Develop and implement an office recruitment strategy to promote and increase downtown job growth and opportunities (1 point; 1)
- 9. Develop a Main Street concept for the South Tacoma Business District; engage business district property owners and other stakeholders in discussions to identify potential options to support revitalization efforts. (0 points)
