COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee

Council Member Mello, Chair of the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, stated on May 13, 2015 the Committee interviewed candidates for the Sustainable Tacoma Commission. He then reported on May 27, 2015 the Committee received briefings on code amendments for work/live building uses, an agreement with Metro Parks for excavation work needed on the Point Defiance Regional Stormwater Facility Project, and the Comprehensive Plan 2015 update. He stated on June 10, 2015 the Committee interviewed one candidate for the Sustainable Tacoma Commission and recommended a candidate for appointment, then staff presented the Transportation Master Plan and public outreach, a briefing on a study that explored the potential for the State Landscape Conservation and Local Infrastructure Program, and information on options for the City to assist homeowners with costly repair of side sewers. He stated the next meeting will be June 24, 2015 and the Committee will interview candidates for the Planning Commission.

Council Member Campbell thanked staff and the Healthy Homes, Healthy Neighborhoods initiative for collaborating with community groups for the depaving project in the Dometop Neighborhood McKinley Business District. He stated on June 27, 2015 the Lincoln West and Jennie Reed neighborhoods will have a community cleanup at Jennie Reed Elementary school, and the Whitman, Lincoln LAWGS, Lincoln South, Lincoln East, and Tanglewood communities will have a community cleanup at Lincoln High School. He then stated on Thursday the Lincoln District will have an open house at 2:00 p.m. and again at 6:00 p.m. He invited everyone in the neighborhoods to attend. He also invited everyone to attend the recently opened Eastside Farmer's Market.

Council Member Ibsen invited everyone to attend the Taste of Tacoma this weekend at Point Defiance Park.

Mayor Strickland stated the next week is anticipated to have high temperatures and reminded everyone to take care of each other and their pets and stay cool and hydrated.
