Tacoma Violent Crime Reduction Plan: Year 3 Mid-Year Evaluation

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Project Background

Drawing from a substantial body of research on the positive impact that hot spots policing can have on reducing violence, this plan includes three components:

- A near term strategy meant to substantially increase police visibility at addresses where violent crime is concentrated and prioritizing street-level deterrence in these areas.
- 2. A mid-term strategy focused on violent places within the city using a Problem-Oriented, Place-Based Policing approach.
- 3. A longer-term strategy that will utilize a Focused Deterrence strategy to help break the cycle of violence among the small number of repeat and high-risk offenders who are responsible for committing most of the violent crime in Tacoma.

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Mid-Year Analysis Plan


July 2024 through December 2024

 - · Violent crime offense type
 - · Violent crime by sector
 - · Treatment and catchment grids
 - · Arrests

- 2. Fidelity across three treatment periods (Periods 12-14).
- 3. POPBP efforts at E 25th St
 - · Process and effect measures and crime metrics


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
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
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




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Mid-Term Strategy

- Problem-Oriented, Place-Based Policing (POPBP)
 - POPBP strategies are carefully tailored to address underlying conditions that
 contribute to recurring problems in crime-prone locations and can be more
 effective at reducing crime than merely increasing or intensifying traditional
 police activities.
- Second POPBP Location: E 25th St Corridor
 - Based on 3-year analysis of violent crime, arrests, and calls for service
- Process and effect measures based on operations plans reported between Jul-Dec 2024
- Crime and CFS comparing metrics between Jul-Dec 2023 vs Jul-Dec 2024

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Mid-Term Strategy Results


Process Measures

- Problems related to urban blight (e.g., monitoring of graffiti, overflowing garbage) were addressed and physical improvements (e.g., installed lighting and no parking signs) were made to the site.
- TPD performed special enforcement missions and other policing activities to address crime problems, particularly, narcotics use, and there was engagement with individuals experiencing homelessness at the site.

• Effect Measures

- Trash was removed, meetings were reported with Tacoma Business Association, and trespass arrests were monitored.
- CPTEDs have not yet been conducted at the site to address physical improvements.

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Mid-Year Summary

- The City of Tacoma experienced a 13.2% decrease in violent street crime incidents and 23.0% decrease in violent crime victims during the last half of 2024 (Jul-Dec 2024) compared to the same months in 2023.
- City-wide, violent crime in treated hot spots also was down about 36% in the latter half of 2024 compared to the same months in the previous year, but it was up by about 12% in surrounding catchment areas used to assess potential crime displacement.
- Total arrests were up nearly 42% city-wide during the last six months of 2024 compared to the same months in 2023, but arrests for violent crime were down by 6% during this evaluation period, consistent with the goals of the Crime Plan.
- City-wide, violent CFS decreased by 23.6% and also by 8.0% in the treated grids compared to the same months in 2023.
- Fidelity to the treatment remained above 90% in all three Periods.
- The East 25th Street area experienced increases in all measured public safety categories when compared to the same time period in 2023.

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
