# **Background**

Transportation Benefit District - 1/10 of 1% sales tax

### Transportation Benefit District Resolution 008

- Adopted November 3, 2015, and expiring March 31, 2026
- Prioritized to fund maintenance for residential and arterial streets, freight access and bike and pedestrian mobility projects


### Transportation Benefit District Resolution 023

- Adopted December 2, 2024, with collection starting April 1, 2026
- Approximately \$7.5 million collected annually
- Amendment for Resolution 023 to prioritize 15% of annual revenue (approximately \$1.1 million) for safety improvements, including but not limited to sidewalks, streetlights, and bulbouts and remaining 85% for maintenance, preservation, and operations of transportation system

- Community survey results indicated support for renewing Streets Initiative and that respondents were not satisfied with arterial conditions.
- Throughout the One Tacoma Comprehensive Plan and Transportation and Mobility Plan development process, community priorities included a safe, accessible, and connected transportation system.
- Community engagement conducted for Vision Zero Action Plan, Safe Routes to School Action Plan, and upcoming ADA Transition Plan update.
