A resolution expressing support for the passage of Proposition No. 1 for the expansion of mass transit in King, Pierce, and Snohomish Counties, submitted by the Sound Transit Board for the November 8, 2016, General Election, which reads as follows:

Proposition No. 1 Sound Transit (A Regional Transit Authority) Special Election - Proposition No. 1 - Light-Rail, Commuter-Rail, and Bus Service Expansion

The Sound Transit Board passed Resolution No. R2016-17 concerning expansion of mass transit in King, Pierce, and Snohomish counties. This measure would expand light-rail, commuter-rail, and bus rapid transit service to connect population and growth centers, and authorize Sound Transit to levy or impose: an additional 0.5% sales and use tax; a property tax of \$0.25 or less per \$1,000 of assessed valuation; an additional 0.8% motor-vehicle excise tax; and use existing taxes to fund the local share of the \$53.8 billion estimated cost (including inflation), with continuing independent audits, as described in the Mass Transit Guide and Resolution No. R2016-17.
