SUBJECT: Indigenous Peoples' Day, bridge naming, and the posting of the Puyallup Nation Flag
DATE: September 25, 2018

ITEM/ISSUE PROPOSED FOR COUNCIL CONSIDERATION:

I ask for your support for the inclusion of the following item on the agenda at the earliest available meeting of the Study Session:

With the approval of the Puyallup Tribe, I respectfully request City Council concurrence to direct the City Manager to: 1. Prepare a resolution declaring the second Monday in October as "Indigenous Peoples' Day" in the City of Tacoma in perpetuity; 2. Make arrangements for the Puyallup Nation Flag to be posted in City Council Chambers during the Council meeting where the resolution is read and have the flag remain in perpetuity; and 3. Initiate the process of naming the bridge that extends from Puyallup Avenue across the Puyallup River to Fife with a name recognizing the Puyallup Tribe's current and historical presence.

BRIEF BACKGROUND:

Over the last year, the City Council and I have worked in cooperation with the Puyallup Tribe to build the relationship between our two governments through the sponsoring of Canoe Journey, the sharing in cultural events, and in coming together in conversation regularly on issues of importance to our two jurisdictions. These actions build on the growth we have seen between our two governments this year.

In addition to the three items requested above meeting the approval of the Puyallup Tribe, the City of Tacoma Human Rights Commission and community groups have come forward to request the declaration of "Indigenous Peoples' Day" in the City of Tacoma. More than 70 jurisdictions in the United States celebrate Indigenous Peoples' Day, including the cities of Spokane (adopted in 2016), Olympia (adopted in 2015), and Seattle (adopted in 2014).

Taken together, these three actions are intended to demonstrate our ongoing commitment to strengthening the relationship between the Puyallup Tribe and the City of Tacoma and to acknowledge in our Council Chambers and throughout Tacoma that the lands where we live, work, and play traditionally sustained the people of the Puyallup Tribe.
