

Memorandum of Understanding

Between Puyallup Tribe of Indians, the cities of Fife, Puyallup, and Tacoma, and the Washington State Department of Transportation

Pertaining to NAMING THE FUTURE TRAIL BETWEEN PUYALLUP AND TACOMA

The Puyallup Tribe of Indians, cities of Fife,
Puyallup, and Tacoma, and the Washington State
Department of Transportation agree to officially
name the new trail between Puyallup, Fife, and
downtown Tacoma, formerly referred to as the
Tacoma to Puyallup Regional Trail, spuyalapabš
Trail. This is the Lushootseed name for the Puyallup
People, translated as "people from the bend at the
bottom of the river", but has come to be a word
associated with generous and welcoming behavior.

The future trail passes through the Puyallup Tribe of Indians Reservation, land on which they have lived on and stewarded since the beginning of time and continue to do so today. For over five years, regional partners have worked with the Puyallup Tribe of Indians and with the community to plan and fund the trail, recognizing a significant and crucial opportunity to honor the tribal language, history, and culture through trail design, public art and the trail name.

In Summer 2023, the partners agreed to a trail naming process by which each entity would forgo its individual trail naming protocol to select a name approved by the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, including names provided in Lushootseed. To create a healthy environment for Lushootseed language to grow, it must be visible in our communities.

In October 2023, the Puyallup Tribe of Indians
Tribal Council approved and enthusiastically
supported one name for consideration:
spuyaləpabš Trail. On November 21, 2023, the
partners agreed to adopt the name spuyaləpabš
Trail and hereto agree to its memorialization and
future implementation effective upon the last
date written below.
