To direct the City Manager to prepare a modification to the 2025-2026 budget ordinance to reduce revenues by the \$8,900,000 reliance on cash and make corresponding reductions totaling \$8,900,000 in expenses and a proviso that directs that \$5,600,000 of the expense reduction is allocated to the 2025-2026 preliminary budget for personnel and offset by the removal of a \$1,400,000 vacancy assumption. The allocation of the remaining reductions is to be determined by the City Manager following discussions with the City Council beginning in January 2025, and to explore revenue options and strategies.
