- Reappointing Luke Byram to serve a three-year term to expire August 31, 2021.
- Reappointing Todd Holloway to serve a three-year term to expire August 31, 2021.
- Reappointing James Williams to serve a three-year term to expire August 31, 2021.

COUNCIL SPONSORS:

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

Appointing individuals to the Commission best aligns with the strategic priority policy related to encouraging and promoting an open, effective, results-oriented organization by ensuring the Tacoma Area Commission on Disabilities has full membership and can continue to advise the City Council in policy making, partner with the community to bring awareness of issues that affect individuals with disabilities, participate on committees, educate the public about disability issues, and serve as a resource for City staff.

BACKGROUND:

At the August 9, 2018 Community Vitality and Safety Committee meeting, the Committee conducted interviews and recommended the appointment and reappointment of the individuals listed above.

ISSUE:

Six positions need to be filled on the Tacoma Area Commission on Disabilities.

ALTERNATIVES:

The Commission would operate without full membership.

The Community Vitality and Safety Committee is recommending the appointment and reappointment of the individuals listed above.
